Guidance for Application Review:

- The most impact on the highest priority needs
- Funding is competitive; do not fund all
- All applicants considered equally
- Allocation based on scoring and discussion

Risk Assessment Criteria



1. Program Complexity: 15 Points
2. Program Experience: 10 Points
3. Other Funding Support: 10 Points
4. City Funding Experience: 5 points
5. Performance History: 10 points

30+ High, 15-29 Moderate, 0-14 Low

Application Evaluation Criteria

1. Community Need and Justification: 20 Points

Need is justified by documentation

2. Implementation: 15 Points

Resources are ready and objectives are defined

3. Impact and Cost Effectiveness: 25 Points

Cost vs Impact

4. Community Support: 10 Points

Volunteer and board participation, reference letters

5. Council Priorities: 30 Points

Program 2 years in SM – local office – increase in service
