About the National Register of Historic Places

SAN MARCOS


- Honorary designation authorized by the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966
 - Federal government's official list
- Applications can be submitted by anyone and are reviewed by the Texas Historical Commission (THC)
- No restrictions unless federal funding or permits involved
- Four general criteria:
 - Events (Criterion A)
 - People (Criterion B)
 - Design or Construction (Criterion C)
 - Ability to yield information important to prehistory (Criterion D)



About the Nomination

- Nomination was submitted by nonprofit, Preservation Texas, to the THC for the *Thompson-Cape Dam and Millrace*.
- THC notified the City in November that a valid nomination had been submitted to THC for review.
- THC's notification letter stated that "opinions in regard to the nomination" are required from the City's highest elected official and the Historic Preservation Commission by January 16







Historic Preservation Commission Discussion/Report



This Historic Preservation Commission discussed the nomination at their December 4 meeting.

HPC Discussion:

- The commission discussed that the site is old enough to be considered historic.
- Raised concerns regarding the dam's historic integrity and whether the dam retains enough of its original appearance.
- Raised concerns regarding the nomination boundary and whether all property owners were notified.

Consultation with Texas Historical Commission



- THC clarified that a recommendation is preferred from the chief elected official and the Historic Preservation Commission.
- Recommendation should be based on whether the property meets the National Register criteria.
- Staff will be taking the item back to the HPC on January 8th to request a formal recommendation from the HPC.





- Criterion A: Events
 - In the area of Industry
- Criterion C: Design & Construction
 - In the area of Engineering
- Pivotal role in the commercial and industrial development of San Marcos for the period 1850-1942 (period of significance)

Direction Needed from City Council



- Does the property meet the National Register criteria?
- Are there any other comments or opinions to consider regarding the nomination?

Next steps

- HPC will provide a formal recommendation at their January 8 meeting.
- Staff will provide the HPC action and the City Council Resolution to the Texas Historical Commission (required by THC)
