Original Allocation to the Chamber

 San Marcos Area Chamber of Commerce \$200,000

Envisioned as a cash infusion of funding to small businesses impacted by the pandemic



QuickBooks Program

- Bookkeeper Training QuickBooks Online Certification
 - 3-5 bookkeepers trained and certified on QuickBooks
 - Helps establish the bookkeepers as businesses
 - Then available to support businesses in this program
- Small Business Training and QuickBooks Set Up
 - Up to 27 small businesses and "start ups" supported
 - Customized bookkeeping and QuickBooks training

Childcare Gap Funding Program

Eligible Families

- >85% State Median Income
- <80% Area Median Income for San Marcos</p>
- Must be working, attending school, or looking for work
- Custom Program Only for San Marcos families
- Transitioning to paying for childcare
- 25 Children served with Childcare for six months



Childcare Gap Program Budget

Scholarships – approximate per child		
Childcare for Six Months	\$3,745	
Indirect Costs		
Program Management	\$3,745	
Community Outreach and Marketing	\$2,630	



Next Steps

Either:

Allocate the funding to one or both of the proposed programs

Or:

Reallocate away from the Chamber and hold for future

Or:

Have the funding remain with the Chamber for now
