While the renderings seem to suggest that some of the existing parking might be turned into new green space, it is well worth asking whether or not such a trade-off is worth the time and ecological costs of sizable infrastructural projects like this. This is especially true of the proposed lot along Riverside Dr in Crook Park. That section of the park is particularly nice as it is, especially for those of us who live in the neighborhood. Why not just improve the existing parking lot nearer to the public restrooms? That would allow the park to remain relatively undisturbed, and prevent it from becoming more dominated by personal vehicles. More broadly, the precise amount of proposed parking here is not very clear in the renderings (perhaps there is more information in the full plan, which I've not yet examined closely): does "parking for 250" mean 250 people or 250 parking spaces, for example? If the latter, the proposed new lots seem far too numerous. Everyone I have talked to in the neighborhood I live in (Rio Vista) is so far pleased with the new permitted parking regulations in the neighborhood and the initial results of the river fencing this summer. No one I've spoken with supports increasing the amount of parking in the parks. Inducing additional demand by increased parking options in the parks seems to undermine the presumed goal of controlling access with fencing -- limiting the number of people using the river at any given time. While this may seem like a rant, my point is that the problem of unmanaged river tourism falls on both the river ecology and the communities who live nearby. 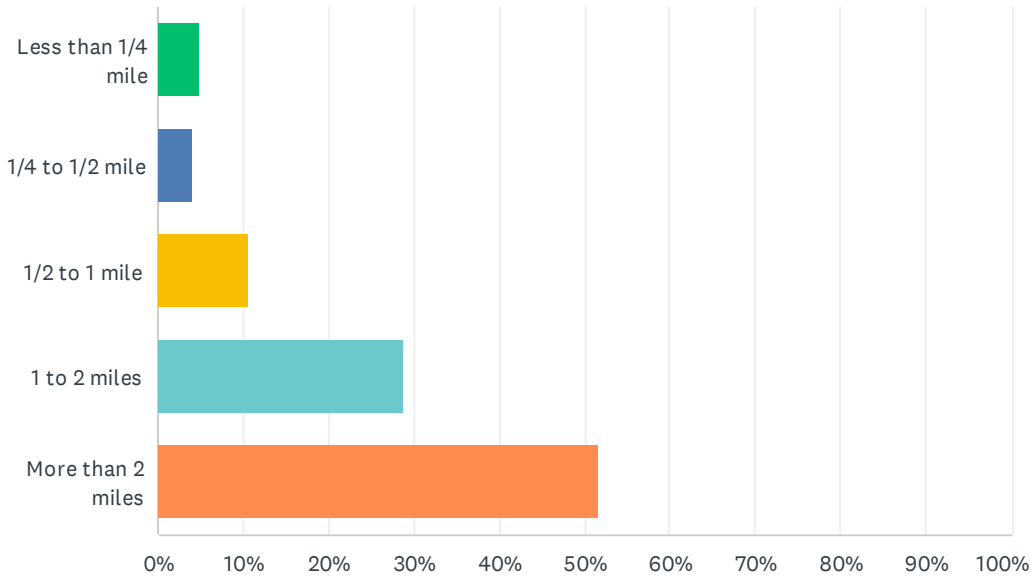

Q5 How close do you live to the Riverfront Parks System (refer to map above)?

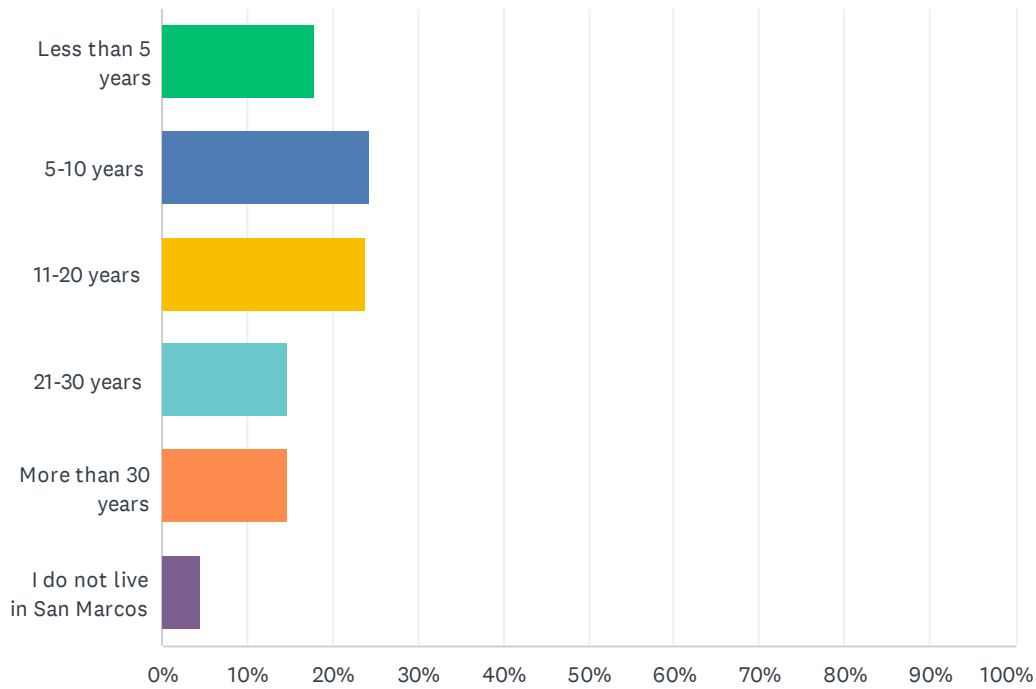

Q6 How long have you lived in San Marcos?

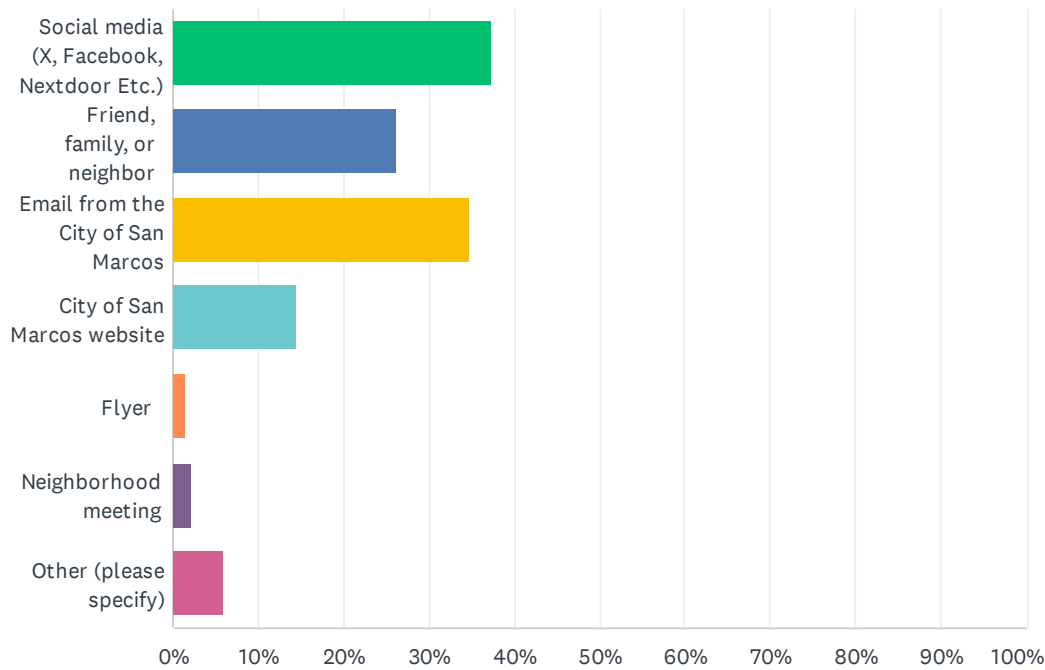

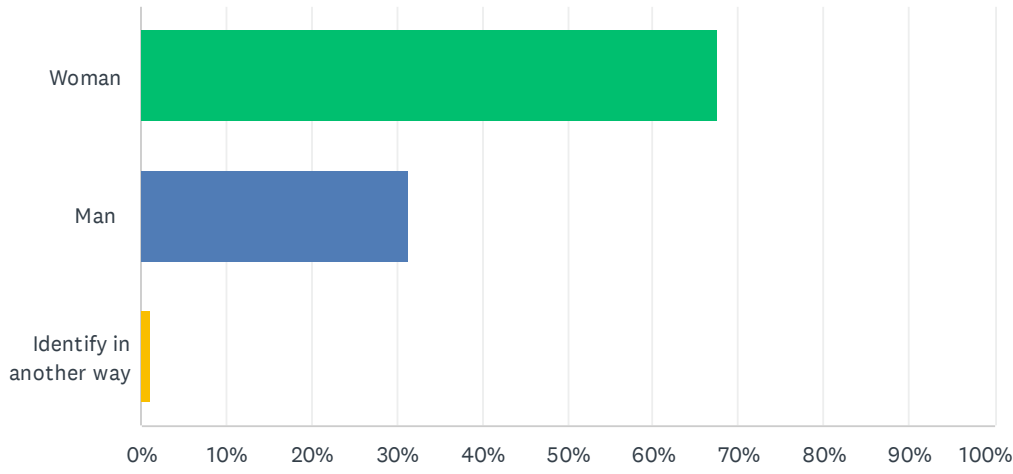

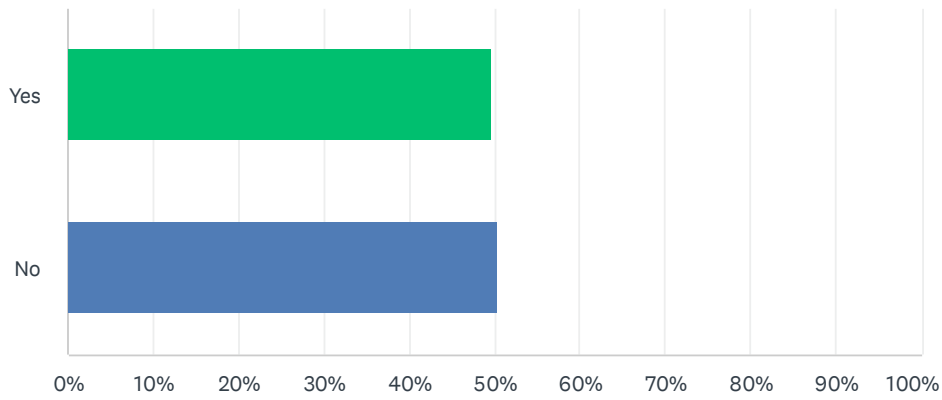

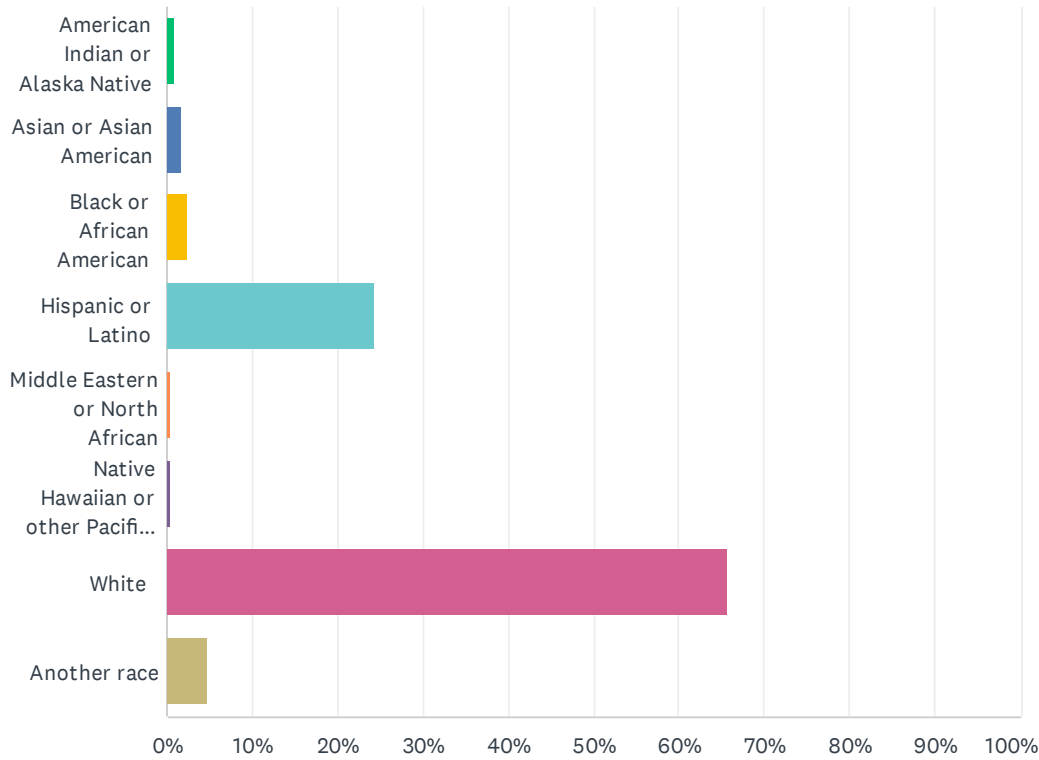
