1. PTACC Summit Training

2025 International Deflection & Pre-Arrest Diversion Training Summit for 6 attendees

The PTACC (Police, Treatment, and Community Collaborative) Summit is the premier national training event focused on deflection and pre-arrest diversion strategies. It brings together law enforcement, behavioral health professionals, researchers, policymakers, and community advocates to share best practices and develop innovative approaches to public safety and behavioral health collaboration.

Amount Requested: \$9,300

2. 911CCT Training

911 Crisis Call Training (<https://www.crptinc.org/911CCT>) for the Mental Health Clinician

This training will help the mental health clinician better understand the upstream processes of 911 call triage and how information is relayed to field units. This insight strengthens coordination between dispatch, officers, and clinicians. By understanding how crisis calls are initially assessed and categorized, clinicians can tailor their interventions more effectively and ensure continuity of care from the first point of contact. Additionally, clinicians can bring back insights from the training to help improve internal protocols, training materials, and response workflows. Their clinical perspective can help shape policies that are both effective and sound.

Amount Requested: \$1450

3. Mental Health Community Engagement Program

The Mental Health Unit is seeking to be more proactive with community engagement. They will utilize these items to increase awareness of mental health issues and inform the community about available services. In addition to providing information, they plan to invest in items that can be offered to clients during crisis situations to help distract from distressing stimuli, support self-regulation, and assist with de-escalation of the crisis event. These items will also include MH Unit contact information so the client will have it readily available. Additional materials will be developed for family members to provide resources and guidance when a loved one is in crisis.

Amount Requested: \$2,000

4. Therapy K9 Heat Alarm Kennel

Replacement heat alarm system for the Therapy K9 vehicle. This system ensures the safety of the therapy dog while on scene. The MH Officer assesses the stability of the situation before deploying the K9 to assist individuals in crisis. The alarm alerts the officer to any issues with the vehicle's cooling system and activates emergency cooling measures if the air conditioning fails.

Amount Requested: \$2,250

5. Victim Services – Emergency Unmet Needs Program

This program is designed to provide immediate, compassionate, and practical support to individuals and families impacted by crime. These are needs that are not covered by general crime victim compensation programs but are often urgent, immediate, and time-sensitive. They represent the first steps in stopping the cycle of victimization and helping individuals regain

stability and safety. By equipping officers with the ability to offer tangible support in the moment, the department can respond holistically to the needs of victims. Potential supplies and items for crime victims, including child car seats, emergency hotel stays, emergency transportation needs (e.g., bus fare, rideshare, taxi), emergency utility assistance, emergency food assistance, and emergency vehicle repairs.

Amount Requested: \$5,500

6. Blue Angels Law Enforcement Emergency Community Needs Program

The Blue Angels Program provides immediate, compassionate support to individuals and families in the community who are experiencing unexpected emergencies while in our community. Administered through the police department, this program allows officers to respond not only with enforcement but with meaningful assistance that addresses urgent, real-world needs. These are usually non-criminal, non-compensable situations that often fall outside the scope of traditional police services but have a direct impact on public safety, dignity, and well-being. Potential items needed Emergency hotel stays for displaced individuals or families, fuel for vehicles, assistance for stranded motorists, minor vehicle repairs to restore mobility, childcare items for families in crisis, immediate food assistance, emergency transportation needs (e.g., bus fare, rideshare, taxi)

Amount Requested: \$5,000

Total \$25,500
