Participatory Budgeting



- Participatory Budgeting (PB) is a democratic process where community members directly propose and decide how a portion of public funding is spent.
- Community members participate and engage in each phase of the process such as by
 - Submitting a project idea
 - Volunteering to develop the project proposals
 - Voting on the final project proposals
 - Spreading the word

Project Parameters



- Projects should enhance the San Marcos community
- Projects must be
 - Within the corporate city limits of San Marcos
 - Open to the public
 - Accessible
 - Low maintenance
 - Capital, one-time expenditures
 - Programs and services cannot be funded
- Not exceed allocated funding (up to \$200,000)
 - Funding Source: A portion of one-time funding set aside for City
 Hall now being used to acquire property on Lee Street







Feasibility Review

- Timeframe: March 2026
- Project ideas will be reviewed by staff to determine project feasibility
 - Ensure project idea meets project parameters
 - Not currently in development or in process
 - Reviewed for other considerations, such as environmental impact, zoning and legal compliance
- Submitters will receive update on status of project
 - Projects not advanced to the next phase will be provided with an explanation



Project Proposal Development


Timeframe: April 2026

- Volunteers will work together to develop project proposals from the project ideas, and develop a video pitch to be shared during the next phase
 - Projects will be organized by categories
- Staff will provide technical assistance, be available to answer questions, and ensure that proposals remain eligible based on parameters




Voting

- Timeframe: May 2026
- Residents will be asked to rank their top choices up to \$200,000 value
 - Name and contact information will be requested
- Votes will be accepted via interactive online platform, Prioritize, or paper form.
 - Paper form may be submitted at
