III. Invocation

Merlin Starr, Director of Spiritual Care at CTMC provided the evening's invocation.

IV. Pledges Of Allegiance - United States And Texas

Council Member Hughson led the assembly in the Pledges of Allegiance.

V. 30 Minute Citizen Comment Period

Rob Roark, thanked the Council and the employees for all of the hard work. He spoke about how the most important things aren't things. He stated that its important to get these displaced folks back in their homes. He asked the Council to focus on the budget and focus on getting the number of how many are truly displaced. Mission #1 should be to get those people back in their homes.

Jim Garber, spoke about drainage at The Woods. There is a point in the process that we have to prove our legal obligation. He read the attorney's statement that was made during the rezoning

process. He provided an example of the bypass channel grading plan via the ELMO for the Council and explained how the collectors and conduits were present, but not fully operational. He stated that the moats aren't complete and the moat can't convey the water if it isn't ready to do so. He also stated that the pipes dead-end into solid clay and it is a drain system to nowhere. The portions that do exist aren't ready.

Dianne Wassenich, addressed the Council regarding the leasing of water and how the HCP keeps our rivers flowing. The HCP has a need for extra water rights also and she asked that we keep that in mind. She left a one page of some of the record floods in Central Texas and how we can expect larger floods(attached). She stated that we need rules that are stricter than in other parts of the US because we have rain fall events similar to world record rainfall events. We do not have rules about piles of dirt blocking drainage at construction site. There is no earthly way this should have been allowed when this project has the amount of drainage planning that it does. This is a high priority.

Melissa Derrick, addressed the Council about flooding and the CM Allen Homes evictions. Who is supposed to be helping those people? This needs to be a priority. She also spoke about building in the flood plains and how the apartments at Cape's Camp definitely caused issues. She stated that our highest concern right now is for the people that are homeless.

Sherwood Bishop, addressed that Council about flooding and FEMA rules not allowing building in the flood way. The Woods are not in the flood way, but are in the flood plain. He showed pictures of the retaining wall of the apartment complex. He also showed photo of a grate at the complex. He explained how it is going to have tons of debris caught in it and the water will not flow through them. Recommend that the City look into redesigning the drainage system.

David Wendel, addressed the Council regarding the drainage system at the Tuscaloosa apartment complex owned by Dovetail. His father mentioned that they had a locks and channels system along the Warrior River to assist in the flooding in Tuscaloosa. They started having flooding issues again when Dovetail placed their project in Tuscaloosa. There was already a system and that project caused water displacement and flooding of nearby neighborhoods. They are seriously talking about putting in additional channels.

20. Presentation and discussion regarding the impacts of the Woods of San Marcos apartment development on the Blanco Gardens neighborhood including but not limited to traffic circulation, parking, and drainage issues, and provide direction to staff

Council Members Prewitt and Thomaides led the discussion. Council provided direction to hire an independent qualified hydrologist to study drainage issues and whether or not the complex exacerbated the 2015 Memorial Day Flood event. They will also be asked to study the flood event in all affected areas and to bring back the results to the Council. Council also provided direction to Staff to bring back a back discussion item regarding traffic patterns; parking; noise; emergency access, and ingress and egress to the park at The Woods late summer/early fall along with potential options to address issues. Staff will also confirm that the 2 time-locked access gates from the complex to the park are in the PDD. Staff assured the Council that the Flood plain administrator will work with the complex to get the soil berms moved. Staff will provide a summary of the event timeline and expectations for the certified independent study to Council once complete.

VI. Question and Answer Session with Press and Public.

Sherwood Bishop asked if there was anyway to keep the intakes of the drainage system from getting plugged up with debris. Laurie Moyer, Director of Engineering, provided him a response.

Cori Schwartz asked if there was any kind of evacuation plan in place with all the students living at The Woods and this kind of flooding happening again? Jared Miller, City Manager, responded that there was a plan in place.

Mary (last name inaudible), asked if Redwood was being included? She also asked if communications could be improved? She asked if the developer was helping in the recovery process? Kristi Wyatt, Director of Communications, spoke with her following her questions.

Jim Garber, asked about if The Woods would be issued a Certificate of Occupancy if the drainage was incomplete. Laurie Moyer responded with, "No."

Bob Holder asked how much of San Marcos is actually suitable for building with most of it in the flood plan? What percentage of the City is outside of the flood plain or not over a recharge zone? What is the implication of planning to grow and expand the City? Staff spoke with Mr. Holder following his questions.
