

American Rescue Plan Act and Coronavirus Relief Funds Funding Allocated, Expended and Encumbered as of December 31, 2024




Coronavirus Relief Funds (freed up General Fund dollars)



73.8% spent and encumbered

 Plan to use portion of remaining funds for ARPA consultant to ensure continued compliance



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Coronavirus Relief Funds (freed up General Fund dollars)



- Utility Bill Assistance \$1 Million fully expended
- Rent-Mortgage Assistance \$173K expended (99%)
- Ongoing Pandemic Expenses \$154K allocated, \$70K spent remainder is encumbered and will be zeroed out with the replacement of Fire Engine 2
- One-Time Grant Funds to Non-Profit Agencies went through HSAB process;
 \$640K allocated, \$387K spent and \$24K encumbered
- One-Time Non-Profit Capacity Building and HMIS Licenses being spent on agreement with Southside Community Center for programs based on Homeless Needs Assessment; about \$275K encumbered
- Accounting Software Training \$12,420 of \$100K has been expended
- Childcare Assistance \$80,200 of \$100K has been expended
- VFW Hall and Cuauhtemoc Hall Sprinkler Upgrades \$165K unexpended sanmarcostx.gov
 should receive updated cost estimates later this year





Over \$630K toward Businesses (Minority Business Stabilization Fund, BIG Grant, and Small Business Counseling)

Over \$450K toward Tourism-Related Activities and Events





Public Safety, Core Services & Fiscal Excellence \$7,162,267



Over \$1.0 Million toward software and staff dedicated to cybersecurity

Almost \$1.0 Million toward mental health clinician, mental health diversion and support, and medical services





Mobility and Connectivity \$1,324,000

Over \$1.3 Million toward railroad quiet zone improvements – includes Uhland Road and reimplementing quiet zones throughout the City





Environmental Protection \$2,161,045

Over \$1.8 Million toward stormwater improvement projects

ARPA: Additional Funding Recommended



Public Wi-Fi Expansion in Parks \$157.80

Covers wireless service costs through December 2026

Additional for BR3T Rental, Utility Assistance \$28,388.55

- Council approved agreement providing \$115,000 in assistance in December 2024.
- Assisted over 20 households in January, first half of February for a total of \$71,000.
- Bring back amended agreement with a not to exceed amount for any excess funds

Next Steps



- Bring back a Resolution allocating available funds from American Rescue Plan Act projects.
- Amend agreement with BR3T to provide additional funding toward rental and utility assistance.
- Extend contract with Booth Consulting to ensure continued compliance.
- City staff will continue implementing projects, and ARPA consultant will continue documentation once funds have been expended.
