THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND OTHER ITEMS MAY BE ACTED UPON BY ONE MOTION. NO SEPARATE DISCUSSION OR ACTION ON ANY OF THE ITEMS IS NECESSARY UNLESS DESIRED BY A COUNCIL MEMBER, IN WHICH EVENT THE ITEM SHALL BE CONSIDERED IN ITS NORMAL SEQUENCE AFTER THE ITEMS NOT REQUIRING SEPARATE DISCUSSION HAVE BEEN ACTED UPON BY A SINGLE MOTION.

1. Consider approval of Ordinance 2026-01, on the second of two readings, amending the Official Zoning Map of the City by rezoning approximately 0.93 acres of land, located at 510 North Guadalupe Street, from Public (P) District to Character District - 5 (CD-5), or, subject to the consent of the owner, another less intense zoning district classification; including procedural provisions; and declaring an effective date.
2. Consider approval of Ordinance 2026-02, on the second of two readings, adding a new Article 5 to Chapter 18 of the City Code that requires businesses to register Bitcoin Teller Machines and to install signage warning customers and users of the potential fraud or scam risks associated with using these machines; including procedural provisions, providing for penalties; and declaring an effective date.
3. Consider approval of Resolution 2026-20R, approving a Memorandum of Agreement with

the Friends of the San Marcos Public Library to formalize roles, responsibilities, and expectations for mutual support; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the agreement on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.

4. Consider approval of Resolution 2026-21R, supporting the application to the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization for grant funding of the Traffic Signal and Traveler Information System Upgrade Project; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to support the application on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
5. Consider approval of Resolution 2026-22R, supporting the application of Hays County for funding assistance to Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Centerpoint Road Project from IH-35 to FM 2439 Hunter Road; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to support the application on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
6. Consider approval of Resolution 2026-23R, approving a one-year extension of the contract with Thirkettle Corporation, through the Houston Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program, for the purchase of water meters and registers for the city's water utility system for an estimated additional amount of \$525,000.00; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the documents necessary to implement this extension on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
7. Consider approval of Resolution 2026-24R, authorizing the submission of a grant application to the Office of the Governor's Public Safety Office, to fund a Cybersecurity Risk Assessment and Evaluation for the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) networks and systems in an amount up to \$120,000.00, with a 20 percent match; designating the City Manager, or her designee, to execute required documents for purposes of this application and any resulting grants, including authorization to accept the grant; providing assurances; and declaring an effective date.
8. Consider approval of Resolution 2026-25R, approving a Memorandum of Understanding with Texas State University to enhance public safety in the Downtown Square area with Texas State University providing support, cooperation, and funding in the amount of \$150,000.00 to the city; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the Memorandum of Agreement on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.

10. Receive a Staff presentation and hold a public hearing to receive comments for or against Ordinance 2026-03, amending the Official Zoning Map of the city in Case No. ZC-25-15 by rezoning approximately 0.294 acres of land generally located on the western side of Post

Road approximately 100 feet southwest of the intersection between Post Road and Uhland Road from Single Family-6 (SF-6) District to Character District-4 (CD-4), or, subject to consent of the owner, another less intense zoning district classification, including procedural provisions; and declaring an effective date, and consider approval of Ordinance 2026-03 on the first of two readings.

Receive a Staff presentation and hold a public hearing (No action) to receive comments for or against Ordinance 2026-04, amending the Preferred Scenario Map of the city's comprehensive plan to change the designation from Conservation/Cluster to Commercial/Employment Low for approximately 199.49 acres of land, generally located on the western side of the 900 Block of Francis Harris Lane, south of the intersection between Grant Harris Road and Francis Harris Lane in Hays County, Texas.
12. Hold a public hearing and consider an appeal by Robert Espinosa, on behalf of Rooftop on the Square, of the decision of the Planning and Zoning Commission denying a request for renewal of a Conditional Use Permit in Case No. CUP-25-61 to allow the sale of mixed alcoholic beverages for on premise consumption at 126 South Guadalupe Street.
