# **Purpose**

- Provide response to utility assistance information requested at the August 20 Budget presentation
- Provide short-term and long-term recommendations on identifying agencies to administer City-funded utility assistance

### **Utility Payment Plans**

- Extended payment requests may be made at least one day prior to the date of disconnection
  - Payment extensions are authorized up to 2 weeks
- Utility Billing Clerks also provide customers with agency contact information for further assistance
  - Community Action
  - Southside Community Center
  - Salvation Army
  - St. Vincent De Paul
  - Blanco River Regional Recovery Team

# **Utility Disconnection Process**



- Disconnections are suspended during extreme weather conditions
  - High temperatures predicted to reach 100 degrees
    Fahrenheit two consecutive days or the National Weather
    Service issues heat advisory during disconnection period
  - Cold temperatures are predicted to remain 32 degrees
    Fahrenheit or below for the next 24 hours during
    disconnection period
- Disconnections are <u>not</u> made on Fridays and weekends

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#### **Utility Assistance in San Marcos**

Emergency assistance, including utility assistance, is provided by the City through several agencies funded by the Human Services Advisory Board (HSAB) and Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The San Marcos Utilities' program is administered by Community Action, Inc.

#### Recommendations



- Short-Term (FY 2025) Proceed with a request for proposals to allocate City portion of utility assistance funding to 2-3 agencies
  - RFP to be issued in the next 3 months
- Long-Term Develop process to select 2-3 agencies to administer program

#### Recommendations



- Process Improvements
  - Refine eligibility criteria of agencies administering program (agency responsiveness, accessible via various forms of communication, documentation requirements)
  - Streamline process
  - Enhance promotion of utility assistance options
  - Check in regularly with the selected agencies to identify/address problems or systemic issues
