The 7-acre Dunbar Park is located in the African American historic district on Martin Luther King Dr. in San Marcos. The majority of residents in this community are low-to-moderate income. The park currently has a 2,000 sq. ft. renovated facility, a playground, softball field, BBQ grill, and some picnic tables, benches, and trash/recycling receptacles. It also has a full asphalt basketball court in need of replacement.

CDBG funds are needed for construction of new fencing, sidewalks, and a safer concrete half court (basketball) as well as amenities including ADA benches, a bike rack, lighting, a pavilion (structure only), additional picnic tables, recycling containers, and signage. The City will provide in-kind costs to demolish the current basketball court in order to build a newer and safer half court on the back end of the park.
