Master Plan: Vision SMTX Comprehensive Plan

Background Information:

The Vision SMTX Comprehensive Plan, adopted in October 2024, is a vision and policy document intended to guide the growth and evolution of the City for the next 20-30 years. It is based on community input and feedback and includes the community's vision for a variety of physical and programmatic areas that influence how San Marcos evolves and grows in the years ahead. Vision SMTX was developed as part of a community-driven process across 99 community engagement events, including 27 pop-ups, 12 workshops and surveys, and 60 commission and committee meetings generating a total of 8,083 public comments. The plan includes 23 goals, 130 action statements, and 59 objectives across the 7 topics of transportation, housing, parks, economic development, environment and resource protection, and arts and culture.

Implementation of the plan is guided by the Comprehensive Plan Oversight Committee, a 7-member board appointed by City Council. The purpose of this committee is to contribute to annual reporting of implementation progress and evaluation metrics, serve as stewards of the Comprehensive Plan, and ensure future efforts are aligned with the Plan. In accordance with City Code, the Oversight Committee has prepared a list of priority recommendations and is tasked with presenting these priorities to the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council. These action items could be considered for prioritization in 2026 by City Council.

In addition to the Oversight Committee priorities, staff conducted an annual report of implementation progress on the 130 action items as of October 2025. This process included multi-department reporting to understand successes and tracking of progress.

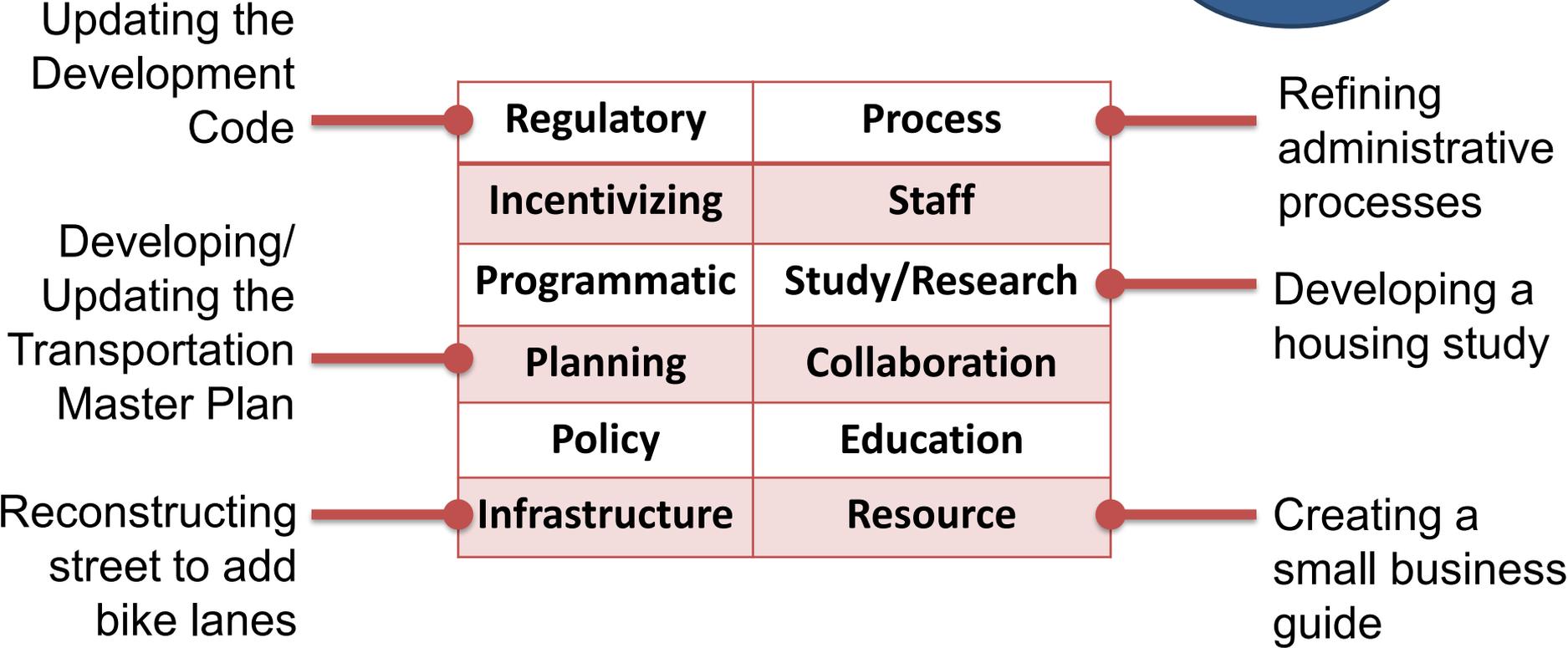

RECOMMENDATION RESOLUTION

From: Comprehensive Plan Oversight Committee

WHEREAS, the City Council appointed members to the Comprehensive Plan Oversight Committee (Committee); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Committee is defined in Chapter 2, Article 3, Division 22, of the San Marcos City Codes and Ordinances and includes reviewing implementation progress of the Comprehensive Plan, adopted October 2024.

WHEREAS, the Committee held a meeting on May 24, 2025, July 24, 2025, and November 3, 2025 focused on reviewing the Comprehensive Plan implementation strategy and recommending priority actions for implementation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Committee recommends the San Marcos City Council consider the following Comprehensive Plan priority recommendations for calendar year 2026:

1. Action TR.1.1 Update the 2018 Transportation Plan to be consistent with the Preferred Scenario Map and address current transportation issues.

The Transportation Master Plan (TMP) update will play an important role in shaping transportation policy in San Marcos and impacts both existing and future residents. As part of the TMP, the committee recommends that the following Comprehensive Plan action items be prioritized for discussion within the TMP process:

a. TR-2.2 Evaluate the need for a City staff position to manage Transportation Demand Management programs to encourage active transportation, transit, and services such as rideshare and park and ride systems.

The committee stresses the importance of public transit and connections to regional transit partners.

b. TR-3.8 Ensure safe crossing options under I-35 corridor and other major arterials/high traffic roadways to connect neighborhoods and residents.

The committee stresses the importance of evaluating pedestrian/bike crossings for safety improvements at key intersections and/or streets which have longer blocks such as Hopkins/Hunter Rd, Hwy 80, Hwy 123, Posey Rd east of IH-35, Wonder World Dr, Aquarena Springs Dr, McCarty Ln, and Centerpoint Rd.

2. Action LU-3.7 Create a tool to analyze the “fiscal sustainability”, defined as the long-term public cost obligations and fiscal productivity, of new development proposals.

The Committee is interested in exploring budgetary impacts of development on infrastructure, utility capacity/rates, and environmental costs. The Committee discussed the importance of this tool to evaluate the cost/benefit of development proposals with regards to the city's fiscal health to inform city decisions. Education on long-term fiscal sustainability and return on investment will be an important component of implementation.

3. *Action HN-4.3 Coordinate land use and transportation planning with proposed developments to ensure safe and convenient connections to sidewalk, bike lane, and transit networks from residential neighborhoods.*

A key factor of safe and convenient connections is proximity to goods and services. The Committee stresses the importance of multi-modal connectivity to neighborhood centers in changes to the Development Code, Transportation Master Plan, and Transit Master Plan.

4. *Action HN-1.1, Update, review, and adopt a Housing Action Plan.*

The Committee stresses the importance of adopting a plan to address housing affordability challenges and emphasizes the topic of availability of diverse and adaptable housing, "aging in place", and empowering incremental development as part of these discussions.

5. *Action ECD-2.1, Protect and promote land uses that support target industries, support diversification of the City's tax base, and enhance economic development by using tools such as intentional infrastructure planning, recruitment, and the land use entitlement process.*

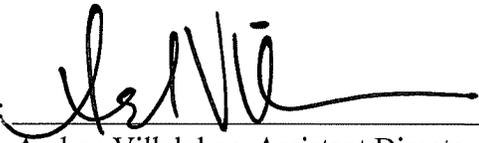
The committee recommends that the retention of small businesses and talent alongside the attraction of new businesses and talent should be balanced through implementation of this recommendation.

6. *Action ENV-3.4, Encourage developers to implement green building practices, and conservation-style development.*

The Committee supports cluster/conservation style development types that preserve, enhance, or augment the city-wide greenbelt network as an important component to implementation of the Preferred Scenario Map as part of the Comprehensive Plan. The Committee recommends the use of regulatory incentives to implement this policy recommendation. The city should lead by example and implement green building and sustainable site standards in city capital projects.

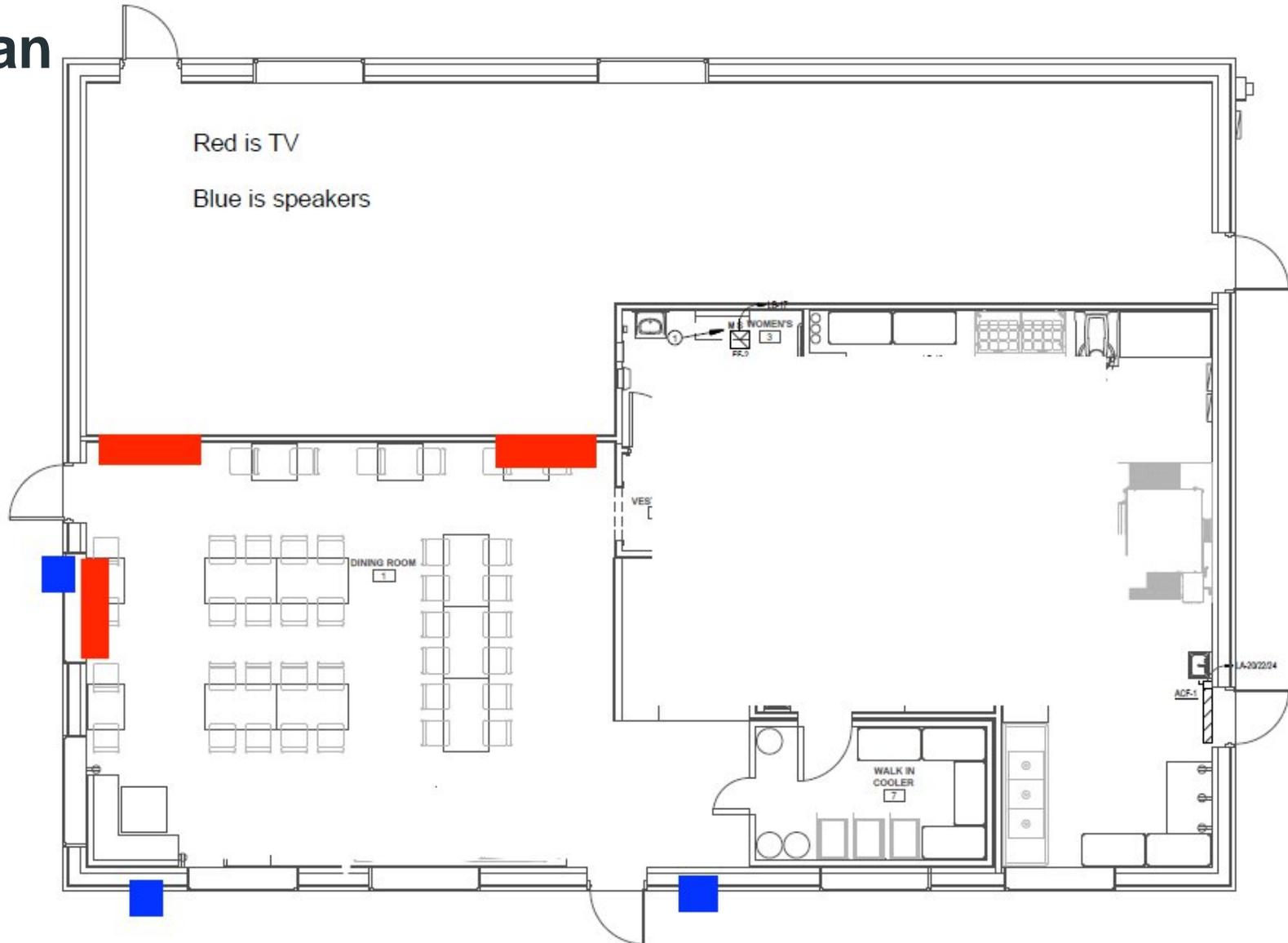

This is a resubmittal of a previous Preferred Scenario Amendment (PSA-25-01) which was considered on first reading by Council on 8/19/2025. Although Council voted 5-2 to approve PSA-25-01, the motion failed because it did not receive the 6 necessary votes in order to overturn a recommendation of denial from the Planning and Zoning Commission.

This request for a Preferred Scenario Amendment from “Conservation/Cluster” to “Commercial/Employment Low” covers 199.49 acres of land on the western side of Francis Harris Lane and is accompanied by the following applications:

- ZC-25-13 - Zoning change from Character District 2.5 (CD 2.5) and Future Development (FD) to Light Industrial (LI) (Resubmittal of ZC-25-13).
- AN-25-02 - Annexation request for the southwestern part of the site located outside of the city limits (approx. 64 acres). This application was approved by Council on first reading on 8/19/2025 and was postponed by the applicant to align with the associated zoning change and Preferred Scenario Amendment.

The applicant is requesting the Preferred Scenario Amendment and associated zoning change in order to construct a data center. Data centers are considered a Light Industrial use and are permitted under either Light Industrial or Heavy Industrial zoning. No proposed site plans have been received at this time.

The northeastern 137-acre tract that is currently within the City limits was annexed and zoned to Character District 2.5 (CD-2.5) on August 2, 2022 (Ord. 2022-45). CD-2.5 zoning predominantly allows single family residential development. Due to concerns regarding the proposed residential use adjacent the Hays Energy Power Plant located on the other side of Francis Harris Lane, Council requested that a restrictive covenant (Hays County Clerk Inst. 22049761) be placed on the site which would require the developer to notify potential residents on the site of the adjacent power plant and potential noise/industrial lighting impacts, as well as additional construction requirements for all homes within 1,500 feet of the power plant.

History

This is a resubmittal of a previous Preferred Scenario Amendment (PSA-25-01) which was considered on first reading by Council on 8/19/2025. Although Council voted 5-2 to approve PSA-25-01, the motion failed because it did not receive the 6 necessary votes in order to overturn a recommendation of denial from the Planning and Zoning Commission.

This request for a Preferred Scenario Amendment from “Conservation/Cluster” to “Commercial/Employment Low” covers 199.49 acres of land on the western side of Francis Harris Lane and is accompanied by the following applications:

- ZC-25-13 - Zoning change from Character District 2.5 (CD 2.5) and Future Development (FD) to Light Industrial (LI) (Resubmittal of ZC-25-13).
- AN-25-02 - Annexation request for the southwestern part of the site located outside of the city limits (approx. 64 acres). This application was approved by Council on first reading on 8/19/2025 and was postponed by the applicant to align with the associated zoning change and Preferred Scenario Amendment.

The applicant is requesting the Preferred Scenario Amendment and associated zoning change in order to construct a data center. Data centers are considered a Light Industrial use and are permitted under either Light Industrial or Heavy Industrial zoning. No proposed site plans have been received at this time.

The northeastern 137-acre tract that is currently within the City limits was annexed and zoned to Character District 2.5 (CD-2.5) on August 2, 2022 (Ord. 2022-45). CD-2.5 zoning predominantly allows single family residential development. Due to concerns regarding the proposed residential use adjacent the Hays Energy Power Plant located on the other side of Francis Harris Lane, Council requested that a restrictive covenant (Hays County Clerk Inst. 22049761) be placed on the site which would require the developer to notify potential residents on the site of the adjacent power plant and potential noise/industrial lighting impacts, as well as additional construction requirements for all homes within 1,500 feet of the power plant.

Additional Analysis

Page 110 of the adopted Vision SMTX Comprehensive Plan states that the existing "Conservation/Cluster Place Type identifies areas where development would be discouraged over the life of the Comprehensive Plan" and that "Development that does occur within conservation and reserve areas should be low impact to the natural environment by using a variety of development techniques and strategies". Conversely, the requested Commercial/Employment Low would "facilitate lower density, auto-oriented retail, office and industrial type uses" (Vision SMTX Comprehensive Plan, p.102). Key extracts from the Comprehensive Plan regarding the two Place Types are included in the packet, along with a copy of the Comprehensive Plan / District Translation Table 4.1 which shows which zoning districts are allowed under each Place Type (see attachment "PSA-25-02 Place Types Comparison").

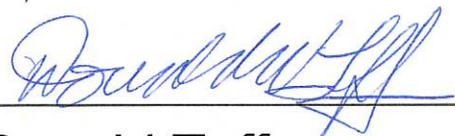

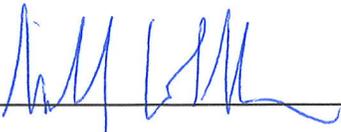

On behalf of Highlander SM One, LLC and Donald and Germaine Tuff (collectively, the “Owners”), I am submitting the following application packages, which would allow 900 Francis Harris Ln. (“Tract 1”) and a portion of 1789 York Creek Rd. (“Tract 2”) (collectively, the “Property”) to be developed as a data center:

- **Annexation.** The Owners have a pending request for the City to annex Tract 2 into the City’s full-purpose jurisdiction. (Tract 1 is already located within the City of San Marcos.)
- **Preferred Scenario Map Amendment.** The Owners request the City change the Preferred Scenario Map designation for the Property from Conservation/Cluster to Commercial/Employment Low.
- **Zoning.** The Owners request the City rezone Tract 1 from Character District 2.5 to Light Industrial (“LI”) and zone Tract 2 for LI upon annexation.

I have summarized these requests in Figure 1 below. In accordance with San Marcos policy, I met with City staff for a pre-development meeting on September 8, 2025. This letter replaces the letter dated September 17, 2025.

Pedernales Electric Cooperative (“PEC”) for electricity. Ultimately, information on water service and electricity consumption will be finalized through the site development process and will be subject to CCSUD, PEC, and Lower Colorado River Authority (“LCRA”) approval.

Additionally, the Owners have worked to answer concerns related to utility service, including proposing a restrictive covenant that would limit water usage to 235 LUEs – which would cut the water usage approved for the Property today roughly in half. The Owners are also committed to fully complying with a new state law, Senate Bill 6, which regulates data center development and energy use throughout Texas. (For reference, the Lone Star Chapter of the Sierra Club supported the passage of Senate Bill 6.)

Among other provisions, this new law sets cost-sharing and disclosure requirements intended to support ERCOT’s efforts to plan for grid reliability and to deter speculation. Critically, the law also provides greater authority for ERCOT to reduce energy to new large-load users during emergencies. As ERCOT’s CEO, Pablo Vegas, stated in an interview with Hearst Newspapers: “If a data center connects onto our [ERCOT’s] grid and the grid gets tight, they have to turn off before we (have rotating outages.”

- **Environmental.** The Owners are not aware of any floodplain or other environmentally sensitive features impacting the Property, and the Property is not located in the ‘Environmental Overlay’ shown in Vision SMTX. Through this process, the Owners are proposing to annex the Property into San Marcos, which will provide greater protections than are otherwise afforded in the ETJ.

Additionally, the Owners have proposed a restrictive covenant that would commit the Property to superior environmental standards, including provisions related to impervious cover, stormwater runoff, green building, and sound limits (as discussed in more detail below).

- **Cemetery.** There is a cemetery (the Nichols Cemetery) located on a parcel of land that is surrounded by Tract 1. The applicants do not own this cemetery parcel. State law (Section 711.041 of the Texas Health and Safety Code) provides public access rights to any such cemeteries, stating that: “Any person who wishes to visit a cemetery or private burial grounds for which no public ingress or egress is available shall have the right to reasonable ingress and egress for the purpose of visiting the cemetery or private burial grounds.”

Highlander SM One, LLC also previously hired a licensed Texas geoscientist to perform a ground-penetrating radar study of the area *around* the cemetery to determine if there were any other burials in the general vicinity of the cemetery. This study determined that “the current limits of the cemetery have been preserved throughout history” and that “the surveyed outer buffer zone [around the cemetery] lacks evidence suggestive of human burials”

- **Fiscal Responsibility.** The Vision SMTX Comprehensive Plan prioritizes development patterns that have a positive fiscal impact, with new revenues balanced against long-term responsibilities for providing City services and maintaining City infrastructure. While a data center use will generate meaningful new tax revenues, it will have only limited needs for City services – and thus will have a positive fiscal impact. In contrast, the previous proposal for this Property – a roughly 470-unit single-family subdivision – would generate a higher demand for City services for things like police, fire, emergency services, transportation infrastructure, and parkland, among other things.

Based on similar data center projects in Texas, we estimate roughly \$4 million in annual revenues for the City and \$7 million to San Marcos ISD.

- **Compatibility.** The Property is directly adjacent to a power plant (which the City has designated for the Commercial/Employment Low Place Type and for Heavy Industrial zoning). A data center project on the Property would be more compatible with this existing power plant use than a large single-family subdivision project.

Restrictive Covenant

The Owners have worked collaboratively to incorporate feedback and improve their proposal. As part of this effort, the Owners have proposed a binding restrictive covenant that would commit the Property to the following, regardless of ownership:

- **Limiting Water Use.** Any data center on the Property will not exceed 235 LUEs or 75,000 gallons per day of water usage (for reference, the single-family subdivision plan at this site is approved for up to 550 LUEs).
- **Improving Drainage.** The data center development must reduce the stormwater runoff rate on the Property by 10 percent below the pre-construction runoff rate for the 2-year, 10-year, 25-year, and 100-year storms.
- **Lowering Impervious Cover.** The restrictive covenant would limit impervious cover on the Property to 70 percent – lower than what the Light Industrial zoning designation would otherwise allow (80 percent).
- **Superior Building Standards.** The owner must seek Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification for any data center development on the Property.
- **Restricting Sound.** The restrictive covenant would limit sound to 75 decibels throughout the day and evening, which is a more restrictive standard that required in the City of San Marcos Development Code.
- **Restricting Uses.** The restrictive covenant would prohibit warehouse and distribution and waste-related service uses, which would otherwise be allowed in the Light Industrial zoning district.

Case Rationale

We believe that these requests are appropriate, reasonable, and consistent with the City's goals and with good planning and land use practices. Specifically, we believe that:

- **The Owners have worked collaboratively to put forward an environmentally superior proposal** that limits water use, improves drainage, and provides superior building standards, among other things (as discussed above).
- **A data center use will produce new tax revenues with limited need for City services.** As noted above, a data center use will produce meaningful new tax revenues while having only limited

needs for City services such as police, fire, emergency services, transportation infrastructure, and parkland, among other things. As a result, such a project would be a major fiscal benefit for the City budget and for taxpayers.

- **A data center use will have a lower traffic footprint and produce less ‘wear and tear’ on roads.** The Property is currently connected to the rest of the City via one roadway, Francis Harris Lane. Thus, any traffic entering or exiting the Property will largely be concentrated on that one road. Higher-volume uses would generate greater congestion and ‘wear and tear’ for the City to manage, in contrast to the lower traffic footprint of a data center.
- **This is the right location for a data center use, from a planning perspective.** Data center uses often require large tracts of land that an owner can readily secure against unauthorized access and that are not vulnerable to environmental hazards or other such features. These characteristics generally mean that properties on the edge of the City are likelier to be appropriate for a data center use. Given this dynamic, other data center developments have been proposed in areas *outside* the City limits. Such projects would not be subject to the City’s environmental regulations and would not contribute to the City’s tax base. In contrast, this proposal would meet a higher environmental standard while also paying City taxes.

Prior Cases

In December 2024, the Owners submitted applications for annexation, Preferred Scenario Map Amendment, and zoning related to the Property, with the goal of developing the Property for a data center use.

On March 25, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment and zoning cases. While the Owners requested that the Planning and Zoning Commission postpone the cases to allow additional time to address concerns, the Commission ultimately proceeded and recommended denial of both cases on an 8-1 vote.

At its August 19, 2025 regularly scheduled Council meeting (which concluded after midnight on August 20), Council took the following actions related to those cases:

- Council voted 7-0 in favor of the annexation request on first reading only. This case was later postponed as the associated Preferred Scenario Map Amendment and zoning cases failed to proceed (as described below).
- Council voted 5-2 in favor of the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment request. However, as Section 2.4.2.3.C.3. of the Development Code required a super-majority vote of Council in order to approve this application, the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment did not proceed.

(Importantly, the Development Code distinguishes between applications that are denied versus those that fail to achieve a super-majority threshold. Section 2.2.4.2.A. of the Development Code, which defines how the City administers the super-majority requirement, specifies that applications that fail to earn the requisite super-majority vote do “not become effective” – it does not describe the application as being denied. Specifically, that provision states: “Development applications where a super majority vote is required by this development code **shall not become effective** [emphasis added] except by the favorable vote of six members of the City Council.”)

- Council took no action on the zoning request, since the associated Preferred Scenario Map Amendment failed to proceed.

We have likewise reviewed the relevant portions of the Development Code and concluded that the Owners have the right to submit the attached applications at this time. Our analysis of the relevant provisions is provided below:

- **General Re-Application Provision.** Section 2.3.4.1.A. of the Development Code specifies that “Whenever any development application, with the exception of any plat application, is denied at a public hearing for failure to meet the substantive requirements of this Development Code, a development application for all or a part of the same property shall not be accepted for filing for a period of six months from the date of denial unless the subsequent application involves a proposal that is materially different from the previously denied proposal.”

Council did not vote to deny any of the cases related to the Property. However, as Section 2.4.2.3.C.3. of the Development Code required a super-majority vote of Council in order to approve this application, the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment did not proceed. This action is distinct and different from a denial, which would have required a motion and a second to deny the application and an affirmative vote of a majority of Council in favor of denial.

Furthermore, Section 2.3.4.1.A. only applies to development applications that were “denied at a public hearing for failure to meet the substantive requirements of this Development Code.” None of the applications “fail[ed] to meet the substantive requirements of this Development Code.”

As a result, Section 2.3.4.1.A. does not apply to the attached applications.

- **Preferred Scenario Map Amendments.** Section 2.4.2.2. of the Development Code specifies that “Consideration of Preferred Scenario Map amendments that are modifications to a Neighborhood Low-Existing Place Type shall be limited to twice per year as determined by the Responsible Official.” The City has designated the Property for Conservation/Cluster, not Neighborhood Low-Existing.

As a result, Section 2.4.2.2. does not apply to the attached applications.

- **Zoning.** Section 2.5.1.2.F.1. prohibits the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council from considering a zoning application for a property within a year of any of the following:
 - “A City Council vote to deny the same requested change for all or any portion of the parcel.”
 - “Withdrawal of the same requested change by the applicant after the City Council meeting at which the change is to be considered has been called to order.”
 - “A modification to the boundary of the same requested change by the applicant after the Planning and Zoning Commission has voted on the matter.”

The Owners proceeded to Council for a vote on the zoning application and did not modify the case boundaries. Ultimately, as the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment case did not proceed, Council took no action on the association zoning case.

As a result, Section 2.5.1.2.F.1. does not apply to the attached applications.

We discussed this information with the City, which agreed with our interpretation of these code provisions and with our analysis that the Owners have the right to submit the attached applications at this time

Conclusion

We believe that this request is reasonable, that our proposal will help the City achieve superior policy outcomes on issues like environmental sustainability and fiscal responsibility, and that the Property is an appropriate location for a data center development.

We appreciate your consideration – and I am available to discuss this case further and answer questions.

Attachment A: Fiscal Analysis

As part of its Vision SMTX planning process, the City considered how different development patterns affect both “the estimated revenues generated by new development” and “the estimated costs of public services required to serve that development,” with the goal of ensuring that the City grows in a fiscally responsible and sustainable manner.

In short, the City generally prioritizes development patterns that balance new tax revenues against the long-term costs of public services (for infrastructure, policing, fire and emergency services, and more). Development patterns that produce greater tax revenues than they demand in public services will help support the City’s fiscal sustainability over the long term.

By this metric, a data center is a prudent choice at this location. When compared to the most recent proposed use of this site (single-family subdivision), a data center will have a lower overall need for City services while producing meaningful tax revenues.

As noted above, the Property is located on the edge of San Marcos’ city limits and is connected to the rest of the City by a single roadway, Francis Harris Lane. This site context has several important implications for fiscal sustainability:

- **Property Location.** First, the Property’s location at the edge of the city limits means that development patterns which demand higher levels of City services will stress City resources over time. Vision SMTX notes that outlying development that demands higher levels of police, fire, and emergency services coverage can lengthen response times and generate the need for more facilities and personnel. Location can also affect other important City services; for instance, outlying residential development in areas without existing amenities often adds pressure for the City to develop and maintain new parkland, which can spread parks resources out more thinly over a larger parks system.

Data centers require less police, fire, and emergency services coverage than single-family subdivisions – and have little to no impact on other City services like parks and open space.

Given the sensitive nature of data centers – as well as the large amount of expensive technology that they hold – owners operate their own on-site security, which deters crime and reduces the need for police services; they also invest in fire suppression systems to protect their investment. In contrast, even in safe and secure subdivisions, residents often expect their City to ensure a certain level of police presence, and the large volume of households increases the probability that one or more will likely require fire or emergency services at some point.

Likewise, residents often expect their City to invest in parks and other recreational amenities near their homes. This becomes particularly important in outlying areas without easy access to existing parkland, pressuring the City to acquire and develop new parks spaces that ultimately serve a limited number of households. Data centers produce no such demand, allowing the City to use its resources to maintain and improve its existing parks system without stressing existing resources.

Finally, as described above, the project intends to use CCSUD for water service and PEC for electricity, and thus will not require City service for either utility.

- **Limited Connectivity.** Second, the limited connectivity to the City means that traffic traveling to and from the Property will largely be concentrated on one roadway (Francis Harris Lane); higher-volume uses would result in greater ‘wear and tear’ on this roadway and will require more maintenance and more frequent replacement.

Data centers produce very little traffic compared to other uses. Residential subdivisions generally feature a large volume of morning and evening commuting, in addition to trips to grocery stores, libraries, friends’ homes, and more. Commercial uses generally operate by attracting as many customers as possible. Industrial uses often feature heavy trucks dropping off and picking up various materials. Data centers, instead, feature none of these dynamics. They are secure facilities that feature fewer people than a residential subdivision and generally do not attract outside visitors. As a result, data centers have a meaningfully lower impact on roadway infrastructure and maintenance.

For reference, the Urban Land Institute, a respected land-use think tank, has reported that data centers “require fewer employees to operate than most other commercial properties, leaving minimal impacts on traffic in surrounding areas.”

The other major consideration related to fiscal sustainability is the Property’s ability to produce tax revenues that can help cover the costs of the services described above.

While single-family subdivisions often generate new tax revenues, they also meaningfully increase demand for City services. Vision SMTX notes that development patterns similar to that previously proposed for this Property (a 470-unit single-family subdivision) have the “the “Highest cost to serve (per new person) of all Place Types” and “generates [the] largest increase in new streets to maintain.”¹

Data centers, instead, often produce meaningful new property tax revenues – buoyed by the types of improvements needed to house expensive computing technology – while generating a *lower* demand on City services. While Vision SMTX found that the Commercial/Employment Low Place Type (the designation requested for the Property) generally has a negative fiscal impact it also caveated this finding by specifying that the “value of non-residential development will vary fiscal impact” and that “[i]mpact on calls for service varies by use (e.g. retail more, industrial less).” In this case, as demonstrated above, the data center use in particular has a *positive* fiscal impact, producing meaningful new revenues with only a limited need for City services.

A briefing in the American Planning Association’s *Zoning Practice* publication sums up the comparison between the previous proposed use (single-family subdivision) and the current proposed use (data center) concisely, stating that data centers can be “highly desirable from an economic development perspective because they often generate a large property tax surplus that can subsidize more service-intensive land uses, such as single-family homes.”

¹ Technically, the Preferred Scenario Map currently designates the Property for Conservation/Cluster, which primarily consists of parks, open space, and agricultural or ranchland. However, Vision SMTX notes that Conservation/Cluster actually “has the potential to perform like a Neighborhood Low or Medium Place Type if a cluster-style development is pursued.” In this case, the Property has most recently been planned for a new subdivision consisting of an estimated 470 detached single-family homes, a development pattern that more closely reflects the Neighborhood Low-New Place Type (primary land use: detached single-family).

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ERCOT CEO: No data center, worries

Power-hungry facilities will disconnect during severe grid emergencies, he says

An unprecedented surge of data centers could be coming to Texas, prompting concerns over how the state's power grid — which infamously suffered deadly blackouts in 2021 — will keep up with the breakneck de-

mand.

According to Pablo Vegas, CEO of the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, residents don't need to be alarmed: A new state law requires data centers to disconnect in phases at the grid operator's discretion during a severe grid emergency.

"If a data center connects onto

our grid and the grid gets tight, they have to turn off before we (have rotating outages)," Vegas said in a recent interview with Hearst Newspapers.

As Big Tech companies race to develop artificial intelligence, a huge pipeline of data centers — some planning to use as much electricity as entire cities — are seeking to come to Texas, attracted to the state's plentiful land and relatively cheap energy for industrial customers.

As a result, near-term electricity demand is expected to grow magnitudes faster in Texas than anywhere else in the country, according to an Energy Department analysis.

Even if many of the data centers proposed for Texas aren't ultimately built, ERCOT has forecast that electricity demand across its system could increase 70% by 2031.

"It's really been just something that we've never experi-

enced before in the history of ERCOT," Vegas said.

The Trump administration has embraced Big Tech's AI push, arguing that the United States has to outcompete adversaries such as China in developing the potentially transformative technology.

Recently, Gov. Greg Abbott appeared alongside Google's CEO as the tech giant announced \$40 billion in AI-relat-

ed investments across the state, which would make Texas home to more Google data centers than anywhere else in the world.

But in welcoming data centers, Texas leaders — particularly Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick — have also raised concerns about how the influx could jeopardize the state's power grid.

Those concerns manifested in Senate Bill 6, a law Abbott signed in June that received some push-back from the data center industry.

Much of the debate focused on a first-of-its-kind requirement that data centers and other non-critical industrial facilities would have to shut off if ERCOT ordered rotating outages. In 2021, these outages only affected everyday residents and businesses.

Reducing reliance

But, according to Vegas, the new law goes further than that.

ERCOT will have the authority to ask data centers to reduce their reliance on the grid before it ever reaches the point of needing to order rotating outages, he said.

At first, the requests would be voluntary, and data centers would get 24-hour notice and payments for participating.

But if grid conditions continued to deteriorate, the requests would become mandatory: Data centers with on-site backup power would be required to switch to their own resources or cut back

on electricity consumption, Vegas said.

If ERCOT exhausted nearly all of its other tools to prevent rotating outages, it would be allowed to tell data centers with significant backup power to disconnect from the grid, Vegas said.

Thus, ERCOT doesn't

have to worry that there won't be enough new power plants built in the coming years to meet projected data center demand, Vegas said, because those facilities would have to be flexible in their power consumption during a grid emergency.

"That effectively means that all of this new growth that's coming cannot contribute to the grid going into (rotating outages). It has to all come off before," Vegas said. "That was an unlock for the state of Texas, to be able to say we can accommodate the growth that's coming."

Power bottleneck

Though the new law has "solved" the supply-and-demand issue, data center growth is still constrained by how quickly long-distance power lines can be built across Texas, Vegas said.

In total, Texas could need \$33 billion in new transmission lines, ERCOT estimated, which would be the largest expansion of the state's electrical network since 2013. The cost of these projects would be spread out among all ERCOT cus-

tomers across the state.

ERCOT has already approved a few big-ticket transmission projects: a \$13.8 billion network in West Texas, as well as a \$9.4 billion grid "super-highway" cutting through the Houston area.

But new transmission projects take years to build, slower than new data centers can be constructed.

It's possible that in the coming years, parts of the grid could become saturated. That would slow down connecting new data centers to the grid in that region until the local utility can build more power lines, Vegas said.

The Texas power industry's challenge is to figure out how to build transmission lines quickly, he said — at the same time that local communities across Texas are already beginning to protest huge power-line projects.

Looking ahead to this winter, Vegas said "the grid is probably in the most reliable condition that it's been in since Winter Storm Uri," also known as the February 2021 freeze.

That's because ERCOT has added a lot more electricity supply since that storm and Texas hasn't yet seen the massive electricity demand growth that's forecast for the next couple of years, he said.

And in the longer term, ERCOT won't accept more data centers than the grid is able to handle, Vegas said.

"We're not going to allow the grid to grow to a capacity where it can't be operated reliably," he said.

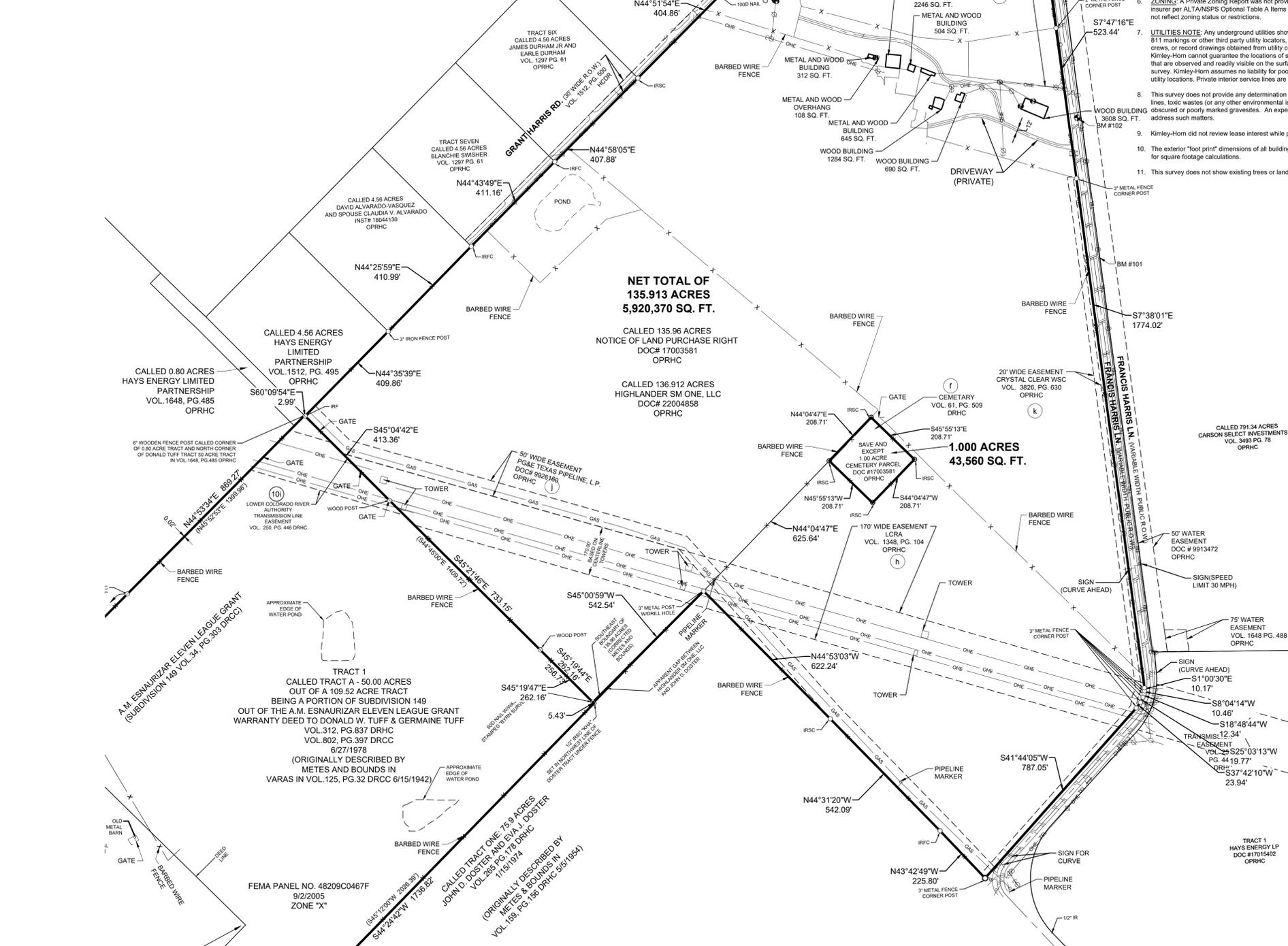

Section 2.4.2.1 Applicability and Effect

- C. Use of Preferred Scenario Map.** The Preferred Scenario Map of the City's Comprehensive Plan shall be used to determine whether a request for a zoning map amendment may be considered by the City Council, based on Section 4.1.1.6.

Section 2.4.2.2 Application Requirements

- A.** An application for a Comprehensive Plan map amendment shall be submitted in accordance with the universal application procedures in Section 2.3.1.1.
- B.** Consideration of Preferred Scenario Map amendments that are modifications to a Neighborhood Low-Existing Place Type shall be limited to twice per year as determined by the Responsible Official.
- C.** A request for amendment of the Preferred Scenario Map submitted by a property owner must be accompanied by an application for a consistent zoning amendment for land within the city limits, or by a subdivision concept plat, for land within the ETJ.

Section 2.4.2.3 Approval Process

A. Responsible Official Action

1. Upon submission, the Responsible Official shall schedule the following informational meetings:
 - a. A neighborhood presentation meeting in accordance with Section 2.3.1.1(E).
 - b. An informational meeting with members of the Neighborhood Commission;
 - c. An informational meeting with members of the Planning and Zoning Commission, and;
 - d. An informational meeting with the City Council prior to the first City Council public hearing.
2. The Responsible Official shall provide notice of the application in accordance with Section 2.3.2.1.
3. The Responsible Official shall provide posted notice and personal notice in accordance with Section 2.3.2.1 for a public hearing before the Planning and Zoning Commission except for City Initiated changes where Notice shall be provided in accordance with Table 2.1.
4. The Responsible Official shall also provide published notice of two (2) public hearings before the City Council in accordance with Section 2.3.2.1.
5. The Responsible Official shall review the application for a Comprehensive Plan amendment in accordance with the criteria in Section 2.4.2.4 and provide a report to the Planning and Zoning Commission.
6. The Responsible Official shall also provide a report and any recommendations from the Planning and Zoning Commission to the City Council when the City Council considers the proposed amendment to a Comprehensive Plan Map.

(Ord. No. 2019-45, 12-17-19)

B. Planning and Zoning Commission Action.

1. The Planning and Zoning Commission shall hold a public hearing on the application in accordance Section 2.3.3.1.
2. The Planning and Zoning Commission shall make a recommendation regarding the proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment(s) to the City Council. The Planning and Zoning Commission may recommend approval, approval with conditions, or denial of the application for a Comprehensive Plan amendment.
3. A recommendation for approval from the Planning and Zoning Commission requires an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

(Ord. No. 2019-60, 9-1-20)

C. City Council Action.

1. Before taking final action on a proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment, the City Council shall hold two (2) public hearings where they may consider the recommendations of the Planning Commission, Responsible Official and any comments made during the public hearings.
2. The Council may review the application in light of the criteria in Section 2.4.2.4.
3. An application for a Comprehensive Plan amendment is subject to a super majority vote of the City Council when applicable in accordance with Section 2.2.4.2.
4. The approval of a Comprehensive Plan amendment requires an affirmative vote of five (5) members of the City Council.
5. After the public hearing is closed, the Council may approve, reject or modify the requested amendments by adoption of an ordinance.

Section 2.4.2.4 Criteria for Approval

- A. The following list of criteria for review and recommendations regarding a proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment are not all-inclusive. Review and recommendations of proposed Comprehensive Plan amendments should consider whether:
 1. The proposed amendment is consistent with other policies of the Comprehensive Plan;
 2. The proposed amendment is consistent with any adopted small area plan or neighborhood character study for the area.
 3. The proposed amendment promotes the orderly and efficient growth and development of the community and furthers the public health, safety and general welfare of the City;
 4. The proposed amendment corrects an error or meets the challenge of some changing condition, trend, or fact;
 5. The proposed amendment constitutes a substantial benefit to the City as a whole and is not solely for the good or benefit of a particular landowner or owners at a particular point in time; and
 6. The proposed amendment will impact:
 - a. Adjacent properties;
 - b. Existing or future land use patterns;
 - c. Existing or planned public services and facilities;
 - d. Existing or planned transportation networks or greenways; and
 - e. The natural environment, including the quality and quantity of water and other natural resources, flooding, and wildlife management.

COMMERCIAL/ EMPLOYMENT LOW

To facilitate lower density, auto-oriented retail, office, and industrial type uses.

Commercial/Employment Low places comprise much of the non-residential areas of San Marcos today. They tend to include a variety of industrial uses, distribution, auto-oriented retail, and dining options, as well as lower intensity, single use and standalone office uses, including civic, medical, and educational. It is expected that many of these existing areas will not transition to another place during the life of the plan, but there may still be opportunities to make these place types better connected and more desirable. New Commercial/Employment Low Areas should be focused on designated areas along or near highways.

Land Use: Primarily characterized by light to heavy industrial, warehouse and distribution, lower density office, and general commercial; additional uses may include civic, institutional, and hospitality.

Built Form: Typically 1-2 stories with buildings situated further from each other and further from the street than in most place types. Larger format retailers are often paired with strip commercial centers and/or pad development (smaller standalone buildings) located closer to the street, but still auto-oriented and frequently including a drive-through; industrial and distribution uses often include large outdoor storage areas; the typical employment density of these areas is 8-15 jobs per acre.

Mobility: Lower density road network with heavy reliance on frontage roads and internal site circulation, multi-use pathways and sidewalks. Major roadways should include dedicated bike facilities and transit connections.

Amenities: A range of parks, open spaces and trails can make Commercial/Employment Low areas more attractive, but are not essential to make them a highly functioning place.





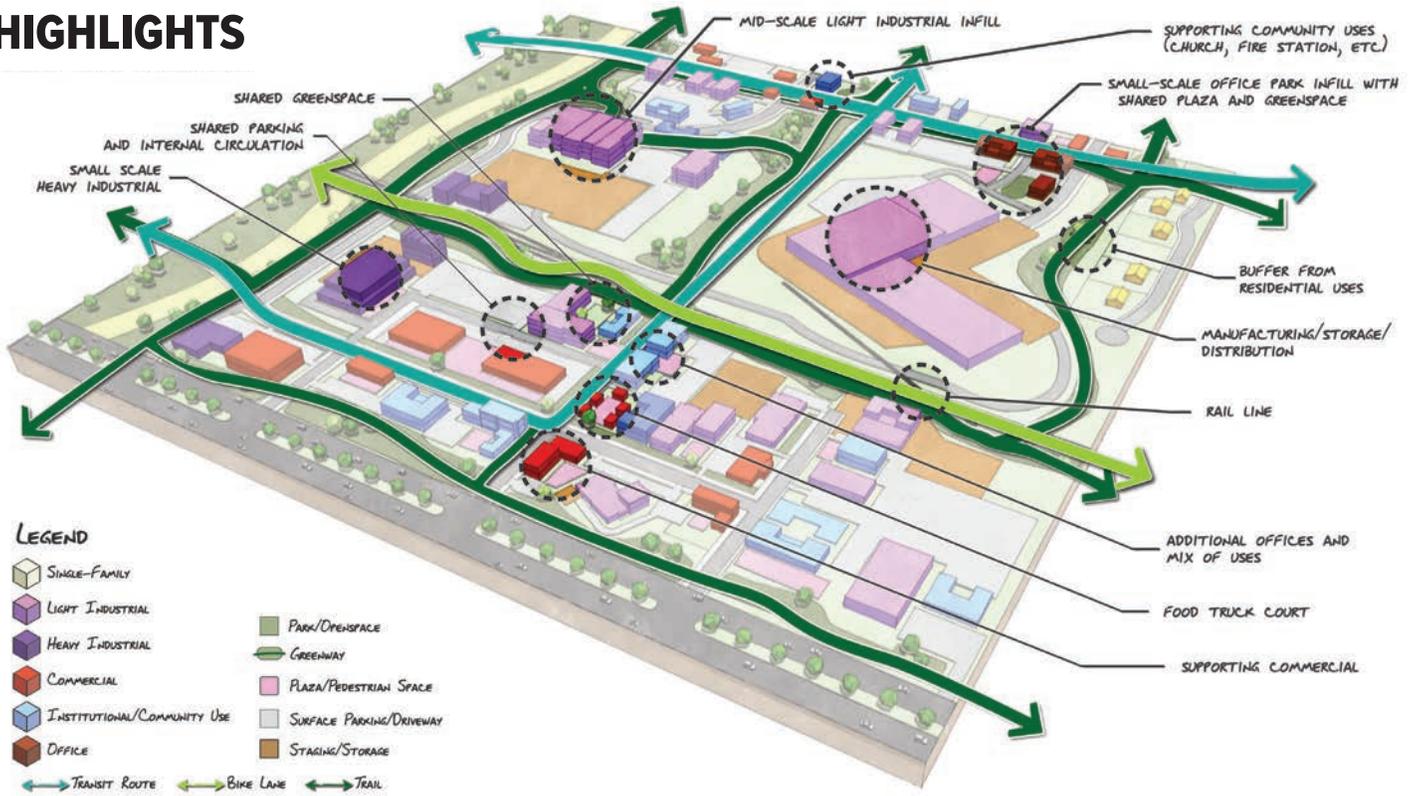

CONSERVATION/ CLUSTER

To identify areas to conserve and reserve for future development as a means of focusing more intensive development in other areas of the community.

Development that does occur within conservation and reserve areas should be low impact to the natural environment by using a variety of development techniques and strategies.

The Conservation/Cluster Place Type identifies areas where development would be discouraged over the life of the Comprehensive Plan. As community and stakeholder input and feedback were gathered, the conception of the place type evolved to also include guidance for when development may still occur within areas that are currently open space, farmland, or otherwise undeveloped. Development techniques and strategies to ensure San Marcos retains many of these assets and maintains a high environmental quality include Low Impact Development, clustered development, ranchettes, and small clusters of diverse housing in strategically located areas.

Land Use: These areas are primarily characterized by parks, improved open space, agricultural, ranch, and undeveloped land and may have public/institutional uses.

Built Form: While little to no development is often desired, typical development includes a diverse range of residential and some small amounts of 1-2 story mixed-use, commercial and civic development; the maximum density of these areas should be approximately 6-10 units per acre in developed areas and a typical net density of 1-5 units per acre.

Mobility: Emphasis on pedestrian facilities, connected trails, and shared use paths. In Reserve areas, utilities should generally be provided locally (e.g., well, septic, etc.) or via city utilities if more compact development is proposed.

Amenities: Large open spaces and trails are the most common amenities; in most instances, the lack of or limited development is an amenity in and of itself and water naturally flows through vegetation before reaching creeks.

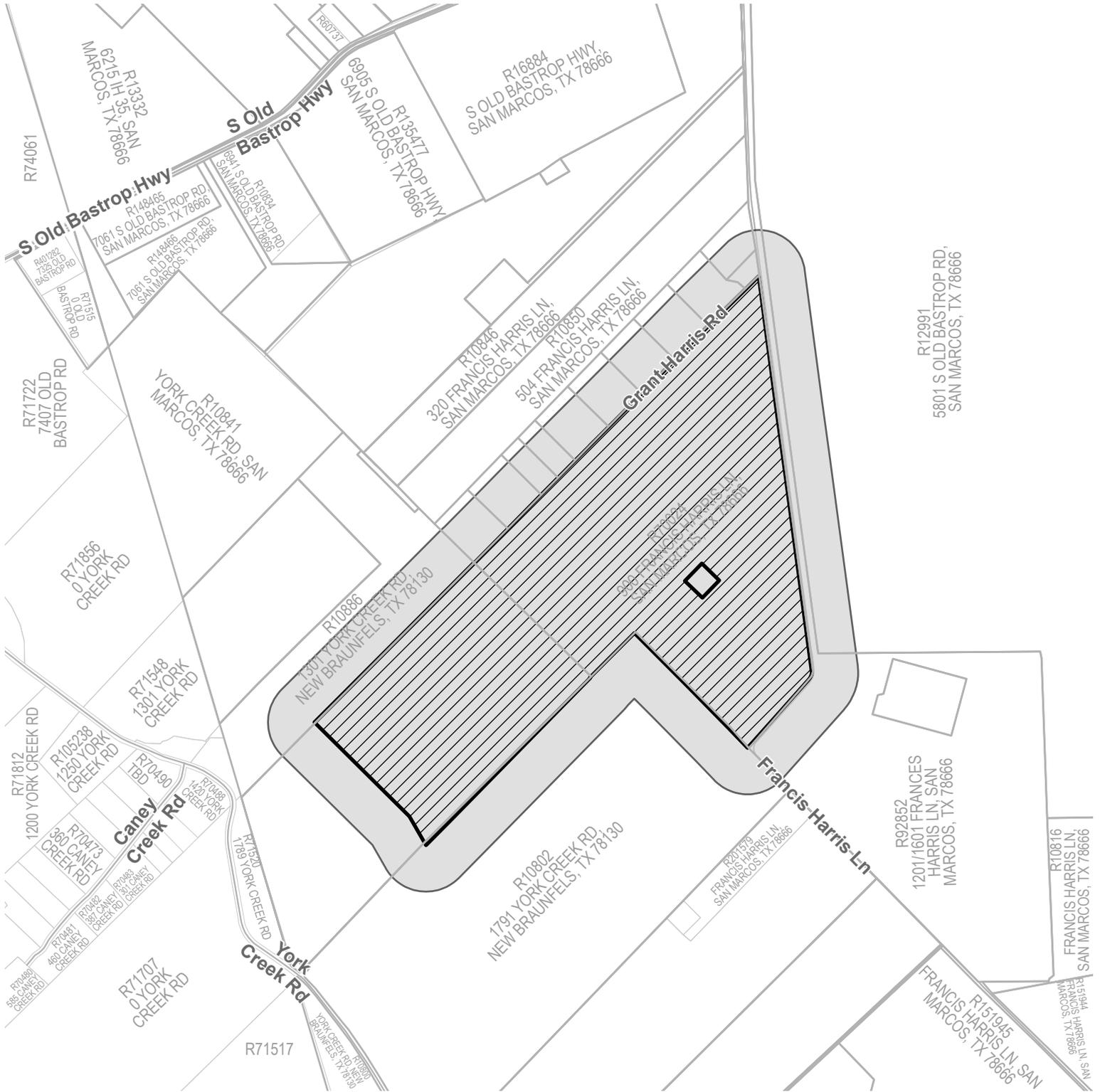
Figure 112: SMFD 8-Minute Effective Response Force

National Data Center Moratorium Now!

Dear Members of Congress:

We, the undersigned organizations collectively representing millions of people in all 50 states, call on you to support a national moratorium on the approval and construction of new data centers.

The rapid expansion of data centers across the United States, driven by the generative artificial intelligence (AI) and crypto boom, presents one of the biggest environmental and social threats of our generation. This expansion is rapidly increasing demand for energy, driving more fossil fuel pollution, straining water resources and raising electricity prices across the country. All this compounds the significant and concerning impacts AI is having on society, including lost jobs, social instability and economic concentration.

The harms of data center growth are increasingly well-established, and they are massive. They include:

- Enormous electricity consumption: A tripling of data centers in the next five years would result in data centers consuming as much electricity as about 30 million households.
- Unsustainable water consumption: A tripling of data centers would require as much water as is used by 18.5 million households – simply for cooling the computer servers.
- Contribution to climate change: 56 percent of the electricity used to power data centers is sourced from fossil fuels.
- Skyrocketing electricity costs: Electricity rates have increased 21.3 percent from 2021 to 2024 – drastically outpacing inflation – driven largely by the rapid build-out of data centers, something that could continue to escalate over time.
- Job losses: According to an AI executive, AI could negate half of all entry-level white-collar jobs in the next five years and spike overall unemployment by up to 20 percent.

The rapid, largely unregulated rise of data centers to fuel the AI and crypto frenzy is disrupting communities across the country and threatening Americans' economic, environmental, climate and water security. We urge you to join our call for a national moratorium on new data centers until adequate regulations can be enacted to fully protect our communities, our families, our environment and our health from the runaway damage this industry is already inflicting.

Hello Planning and Zoning members,

I watched the P&Z meeting 12-9-25. You are having to do very difficult work, and some of the responses to your questions seemed to be lacking some specificity. In terms of the total water use that data centers extract through direct use internally and indirect use from energy production at thermal plants, (gas or nuclear), I wanted to provide you with additional information.

Water use for production of energy is a real concern for the proposed data center. Since they are estimating 4 buildings, we can assume that this data center will be a 400 MW demand (generally built in 100 MW/building). According to the 2025 Texas Water Development Board 10-year Regional Water plan, 0.25 gallons of water is needed to cool a thermal power plant for each kwh it generates. For a 400 MW plant running 24 hours a day, this would be $400 \text{ MW} \times 1000 \text{ kw/MW} \times 24 \text{ hours} \times 0.25 \text{ gal/kwh} = 2.4$ Million gallons/day to cool the power plant that powers the data center. Plus the 75,000 gallons/day to cool the equipment in the data center. So each of you with water use questions is correct to be concerned.

When it comes to water, the City of San Marcos, Crystal Clear and the Hays Energy Plant get their water from the same sources: GBRA with the primary source (50% for San Marcos) from Canyon Lake. So it is important because they may be 3 different entities, but rely on the same source of water. See below for supporting documents:

What are the power sources for PEC? LCRA and solar and wind assets. LCRA power plant is located in LaGrange and outside of the GBRA watershed.

I think an important “Ask” of this project is that the data center commit to using PEC as the source of power for a very long-term period (20-30 years). My real concern is that the data center owners and designers will find it “more efficient” to buy power directly from the Hays Energy plant once approval is granted to build from the City of San Marcos. Likewise, Hays Energy has a capacity of 900 MW and may find it economically more feasible to sell directly to one source rather than add power to the grid to be overseen by ERCOT. Power from the Hays Energy Plant means water from the GBRA water sources at 2.4 million gallons/day for a 400 MW generation rate. This will reduce water from the sources that Crystal Clear and the City of San Marcos get drinking water from.

The city of San Marcos provides 1.6 Million Gallons a day of reclaimed water (Utility Director Tyler Hjorth) to Hays Energy for cooling. This is all they have at this point with other sources going to Texas State and Kissing Tree. Data centers have a tendency to expand their size of operations once built and this would place an even higher water demand on the power generation and power plant water needs.

City staff, Mark Enders, the Habitat Conservation Coordinator [REDACTED] is very familiar with the critically low water levels in Canyon Lake, and the Edwards Aquifer and the low flows in the San Marcos River. Robert Mace with the Meadows Center [REDACTED] is also very knowledgeable about our limited water supplies and could provide valuable insight. Reaching out to these two gentlemen, could give you all needed insight on this side of the decision process.

In my opinion, if controls are put into place to 1) require the data center to report at least monthly on its average daily water use 2) limit the internal water use to the proposed 75,000 gallons, and 3) prohibit the data center from utilizing the adjacent power plant for its energy source (i.e. commit to PEC as proposed), then the project impact on the City's drinking water sources can be minimized.

Thank you for considering these thoughts.

RESTRICTIVE COVENANT AGREEMENT

THIS RESTRICTIVE COVENANT AGREEMENT (this "**Agreement**") is made and entered into as of the _____ day of _____, 20____, by and between Highlander SM One, LLC, a Texas limited liability company ("**Highlander**"), and Donald W. Tuff and Germaine Tuff ("**Tuffs**", and together with Highlander, the "**Owner**"), and the City of San Marcos, Texas (the "**City**").

RECITALS:

A. Highlander is the owner of a tract of land totaling approximately 135.912 acres situated in Hays County, Texas, more particularly described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto, and the Tuffs are the owner of a tract of land totaling approximately 63.578 acres situated in Hays County, Texas, more particularly described in Exhibit "A-1", attached hereto (collectively, the "**Property**").

B. Owner submitted an application to the City on September 17, 2025 for the rezoning of the Property to Light Industrial pursuant to Zoning Request ZC-25-02 (the "**Zoning Case**").

C. A data center is expected to be built on the Property. For purposes of this Agreement, a "data center" is a property classification, which means a building or buildings primarily used to house computer systems and associated components, such as telecommunications and storage system.

D. The City has required this Agreement in connection with the Zoning Case in order to permit the development of a data center on the Property, and the Owner desires to subject the Property to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00), and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which the parties hereby acknowledge, the Owner and the City do hereby agree as follows:

1. Establishment of Restrictive Covenant. All of the recitals above are incorporated herein. The Parties hereto agree and acknowledge that the Property shall be held, sold, transferred, conveyed and occupied subject to the following:

(A) The following uses and activities are prohibited on the Property:

- (i) Warehouse and Distribution*
- (ii) Waste-Related Service*

** As such uses are defined in the 2025 San Marcos Development Code.*

(B) If a data center is constructed on the Property, the data center will utilize a closed-loop, non-evaporative cooling system or similar system to cool the technology assets in the

data center. Regardless, water usage at the data center will not exceed 235 LUEs or 75,000 gallons per day.

(C) If a data center is constructed on the Property, drainage facilities shall be designed and constructed so that the rate of runoff from a site after construction shall be ten percent (10%) less than the runoff prior to construction for the two (2), ten (10), twenty five (25), and one hundred (100) year storm frequencies.

(D) If a data center is constructed on the Property, water quality facilities will be constructed that meet a Total Suspended Solid (TSS) removal requirement of at least 80% for the site.

(E) If a data center is constructed on the Property, the impervious cover for a data center will be no more than 70% of the Property.

(F) If a data center is constructed on the Property, Owner will pursue a LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification for the buildings within twelve (12) months from the date of the final certificate of occupancy and commissioning of building systems for the last building to be constructed on the Property and a copy of the submitted application will be made available to the City of San Marcos for inspection.

(G) If a data center is constructed on the Property, then the noise level maximums set forth in Section 7.4.2.1(A) of the City of San Marcos Land Development Code as in effect on the date hereof shall be 75 decibels as measured from either the closest public right-of-way to the Property or from the property line of the complainant per Section 7.4.2.1(B) of the City of San Marcos Land Development Code in effect on the date hereof.

(H) If a data center is constructed on the Property, during construction the following requirements will be met and reasonable signage on the jobsite in both English and Spanish will list these standards:

- Compliance with all relevant local, state, and federal safety laws;
- All construction workers on the project will be paid by check or direct deposit, or other commercially used payment method, including electronic or other payment methods that are customary in the industry;
- All construction workers on the project will be covered by workers' compensation insurance as required by state or federal law;
- All construction workers on the project will receive personal protective equipment, free of charge if not already provided by the employer as required by state or federal law;
- All safety supervisors on the project will be current on their 30-hour, OSHA approved construction worker safety class prior to commencing construction work as

required by state or federal law.

2. **Remedies.** The City and Owner may pursue any remedies available at law or in equity to enforce the provisions of this Agreement, including the recovery of reasonable attorney's fees and court costs.

3. **No Waiver.** The failure of the City or Owner to avail itself of any of the privileges, rights, covenants, agreements, terms and conditions of this Agreement for any period of time or at any time shall not be construed or deemed to be a waiver thereof, and nothing herein contained, nor anything done or omitted to be done by the City or Owner pursuant hereto, shall be deemed a waiver by the other of any of its rights and remedies hereunder or under the laws of the State of Texas. The enforcement of any right or remedy hereunder by the City, either prior to, simultaneously with, or subsequent to any other action taken hereunder, shall not be deemed an election of remedies.

4. **Modification.** This Agreement may not be modified or amended unless such modification or amendment has been reduced to writing approved by the city council of the City and signed by all of the then-existing owners of the Property or portions thereof, and by the City, and has been recorded in the Official Public Records of Hays County, Texas.

5. **Binding Effect.** The obligations created hereunder shall create mutual benefits and servitudes running with the land. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors, heirs and assigns.

6. **Partial Invalidity.** If any provision of this Agreement shall be or become invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect under any applicable law, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected or impaired thereby.

7. **Term.** Unless earlier terminated as provided herein, this Agreement shall be in effect for a period of twenty (20) years from the date hereof, i.e. this Agreement shall expire on the 20th anniversary of the date of this Agreement set forth above. Upon expiration of the twenty (20) year term, this Agreement shall automatically expire and be of no further force or effect.

8. **Misc. Provisions.** This Agreement may only be enforced by the Owner and the City. The City may not assign this Agreement. Owner may assign this Agreement. There are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement. Upon Owner's request and within thirty (30) days of the request, the City agrees to provide Owner written confirmation that Owner is not in violation of any provision in this Agreement. If as part of that written confirmation the City believes Owner is not in compliance with any provision, City will state with specificity the details related to the lack of compliance and specifically how Owner does not comply. Lenders and Tenants may rely on City's confirmation.

9. **Chapter 245.** This Agreement establishes vested rights of Owner pursuant to Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code.

10. **Condition Precedent.** It is a condition precedent to the effectiveness of this Agreement that the rezoning of the Property pursuant to the Zoning Case has been fully and finally approved by the San Marcos City Council on or before March 18, 2026. If such rezoning is not

fully and finally approved by the San Marcos City Council by such date for any reason, then this Agreement shall expire on such date and thereafter shall be of no force or effect.

11. Default. If any party defaults under this Agreement, then the non-defaulting party will not exercise any remedies for such default unless the defaulting party fails to cure such breach within thirty (30) days following the non-defaulting party's delivery of written notice of such breach to the defaulting party by hand delivery or overnight mail; provided, however, that if the particular default cannot reasonably be cured within thirty (30) days, then such 30-day cure period will be extended for up to two (2) additional thirty (30) day periods to allow the defaulting party a reasonable opportunity to cure its breach, so long as the defaulting party commences the required cure within such 30-day period and thereafter diligently pursues the same to completion.

12. No Dedication. Nothing in this Agreement shall ever constitute or be construed as a dedication of any interest herein described to the public or give any member of the public any right whatsoever.

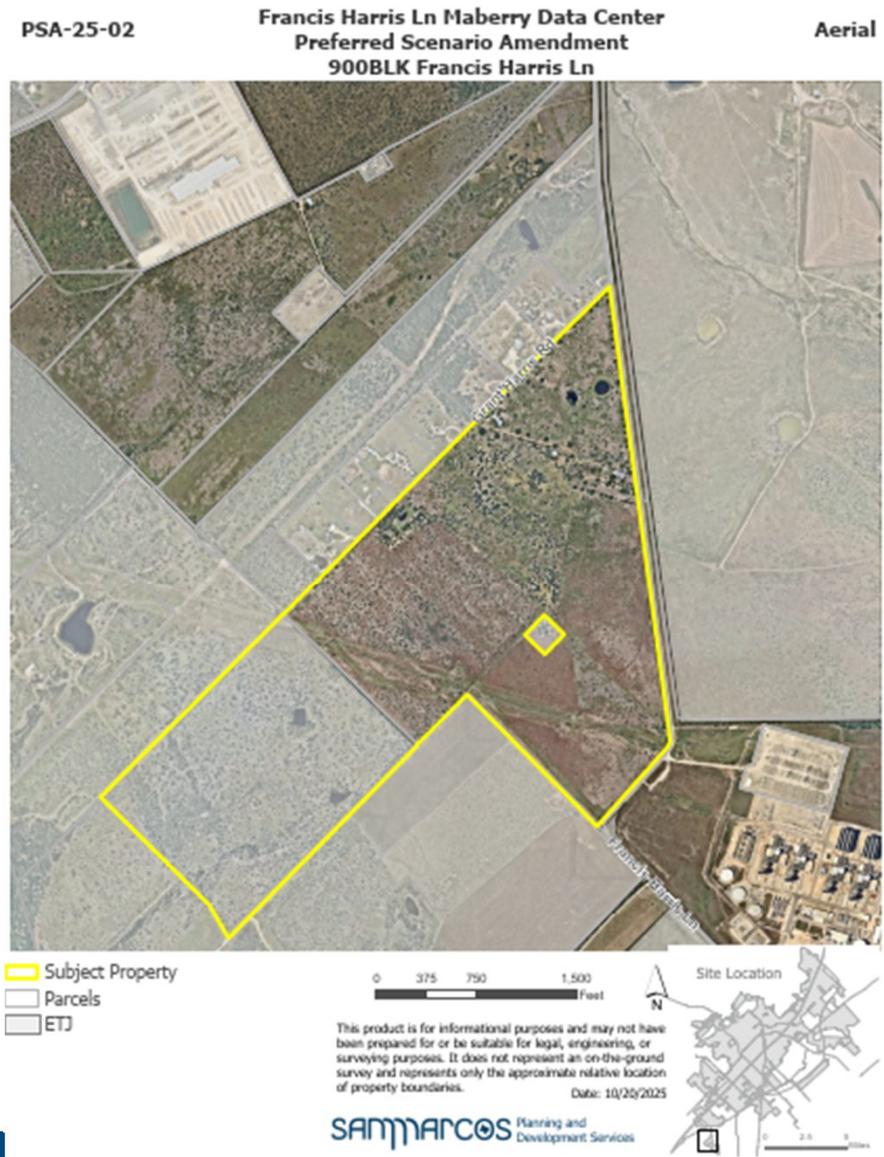

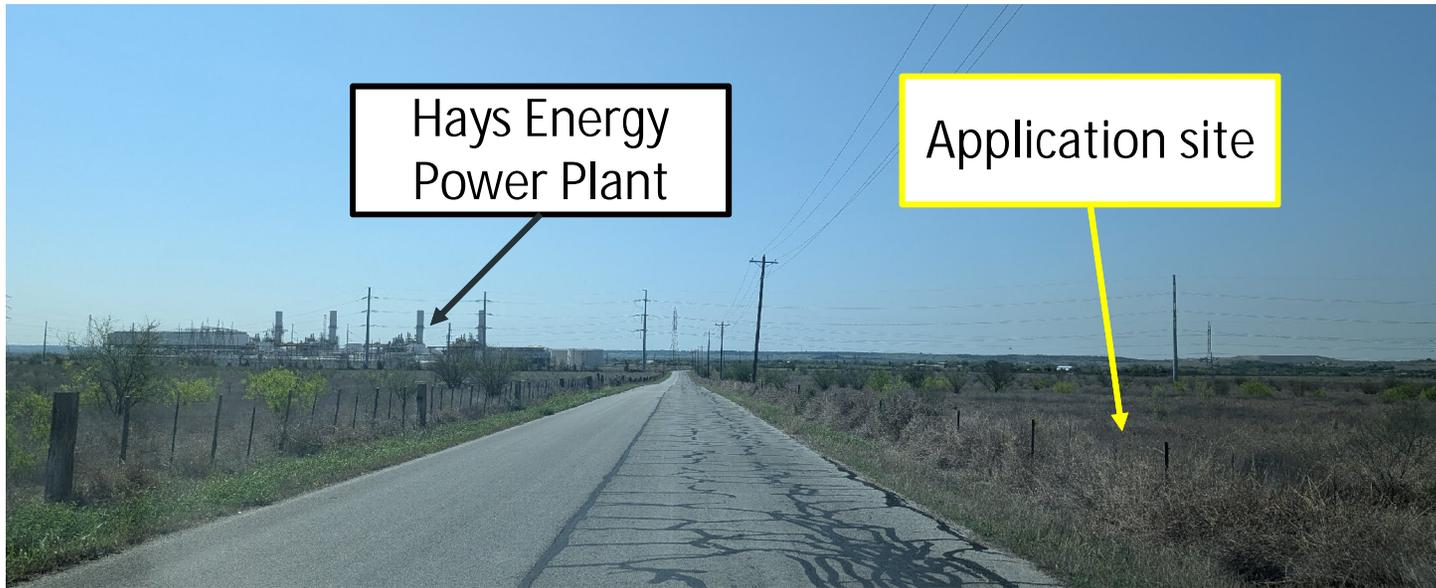

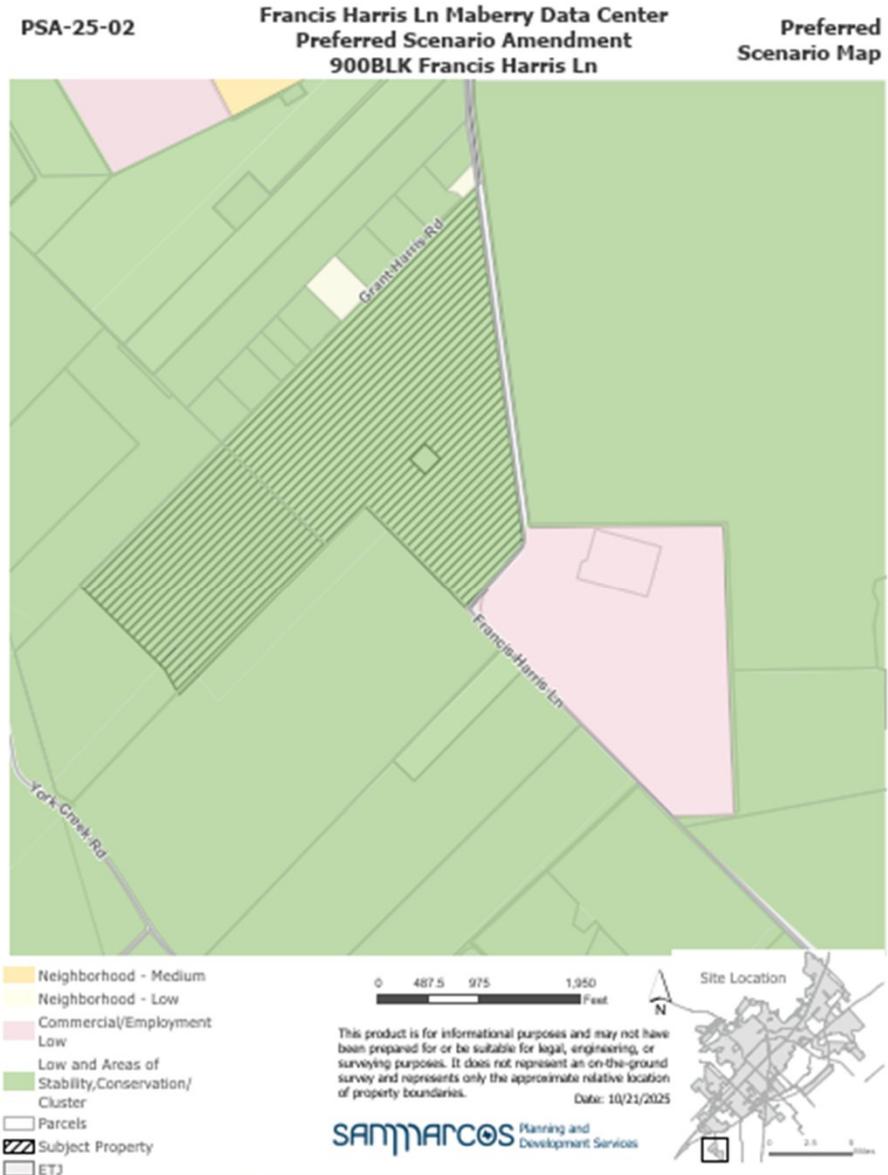


Existing Context (Francis Harris Lane Southbound View)

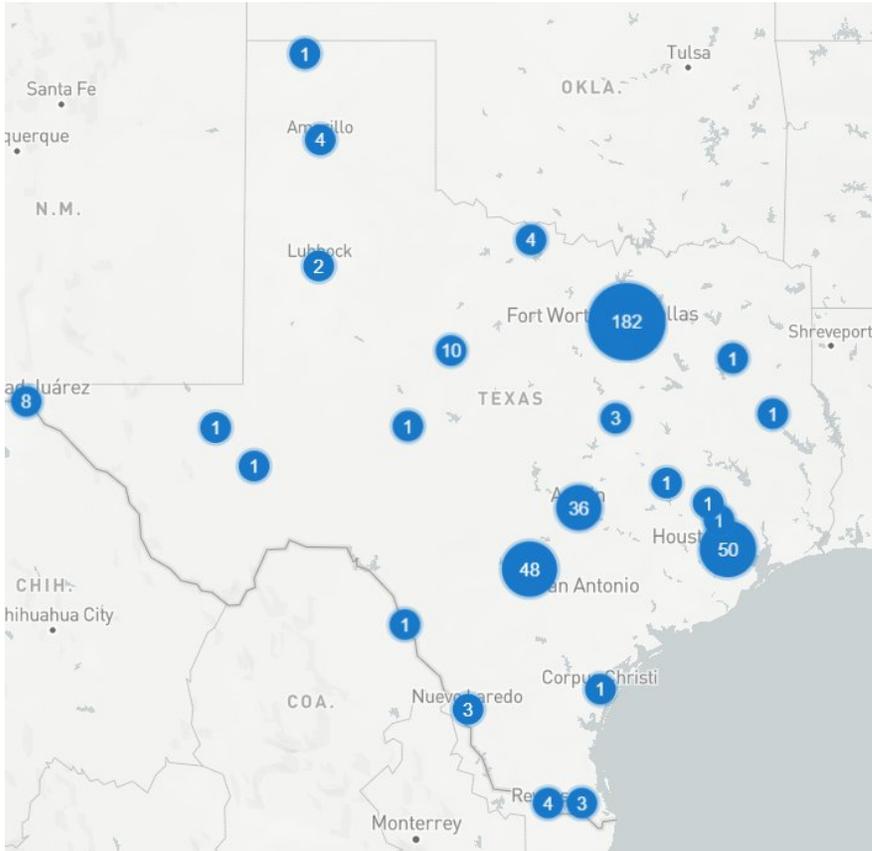

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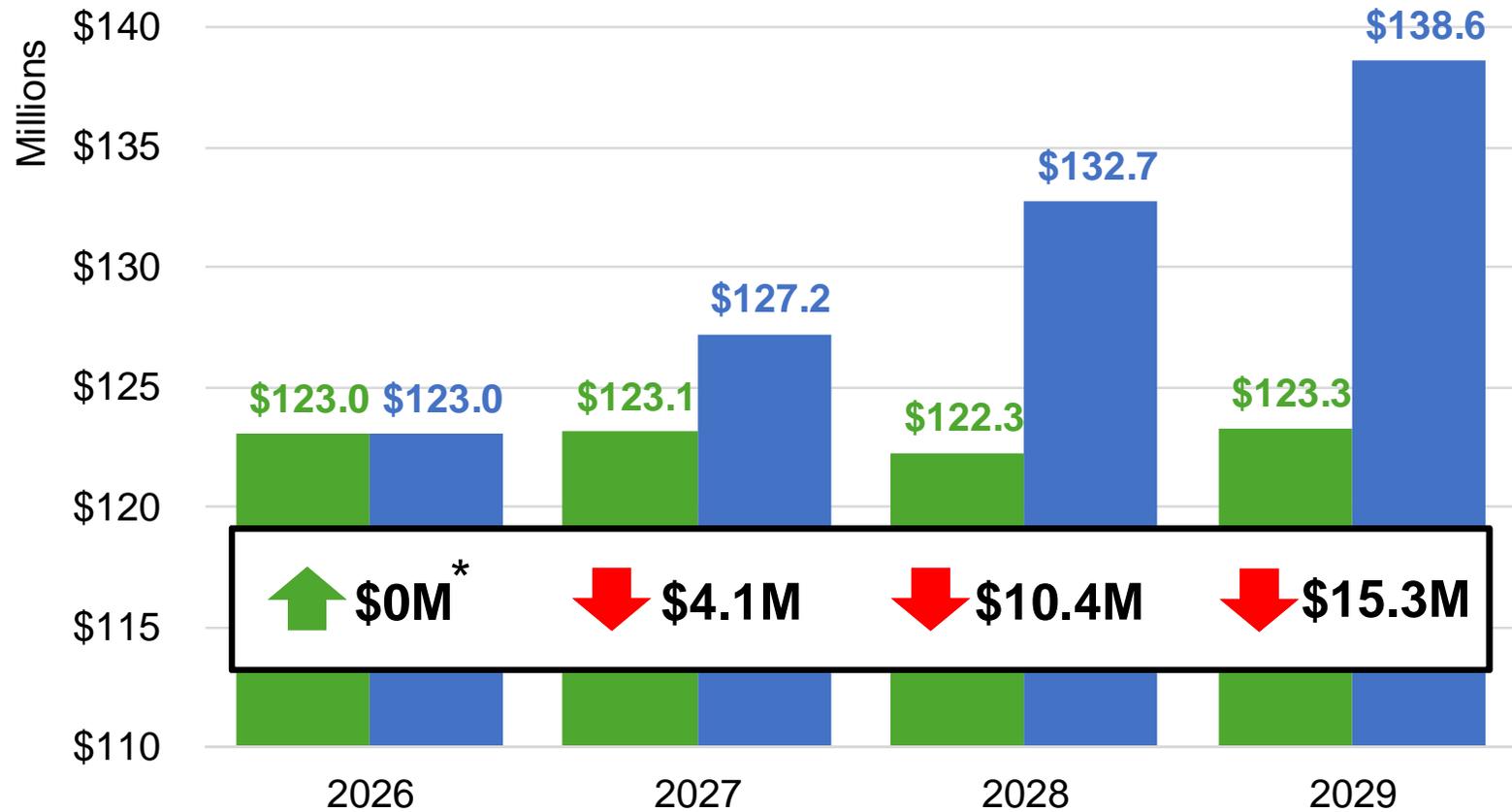

History

This is a resubmittal of a previous zoning change request (ZC-25-02) which was recommended 6-1 for denial by the Planning and Zoning Commission at their March 25, 2025, meeting. It was then withdrawn by the applicant after the associated Preferred Scenario Amendment (PSA-25-01) failed to receive the necessary votes for approval by Council at their August 19, 2025, meeting.

This zoning change covers 199.49 acres of land on the western side of Francis Harris Lane and is accompanied by the following applications:

- PSA-25-02 – Preferred Scenario Amendment from Conservation/ Cluster to Commercial/Employment – Low. (resubmittal of PSA-25-01)
- AN-25-02 - Annexation request for the southwestern part of the site located outside of the city limits (approx. 64 acres).

The applicant is requesting this zoning change in order to construct a data center. Data centers are considered a Light Industrial use and so would only be permitted under either Light Industrial or Heavy Industrial zoning. No proposed site plans have been received at this time.

Additional Analysis

Per Table 4.1 of the Land Development Code, Light Industrial zoning is not permitted within Conservation/Cluster Place Types. Approval of the associated Preferred Scenario Amendment to Commercial/Employment – Low (PSA-25-02) is required before this zoning change can be approved.

Grant Harris Rd, a private driveway/ access easement with several residential structures, runs along the northwestern boundary of the property. These properties do not currently have any direct roadway frontage – the City of San Marcos Thoroughfare Plan would require the developer to dedicate Right of Way at the time of platting which would provide direct road frontage to these properties.

Staff is proposing to designate a 50' Character District-1 (CD-1) buffer along the northwestern boundary of the property adjacent Grant Harris Rd. The applicant agrees with this modification of the request.

On behalf of Highlander SM One, LLC and Donald and Germaine Tuff (collectively, the “Owners”), I am submitting the following application packages, which would allow 900 Francis Harris Ln. (“Tract 1”) and a portion of 1789 York Creek Rd. (“Tract 2”) (collectively, the “Property”) to be developed as a data center:

- **Annexation.** The Owners have a pending request for the City to annex Tract 2 into the City’s full-purpose jurisdiction. (Tract 1 is already located within the City of San Marcos.)
- **Preferred Scenario Map Amendment.** The Owners request the City change the Preferred Scenario Map designation for the Property from Conservation/Cluster to Commercial/Employment Low.
- **Zoning.** The Owners request the City rezone Tract 1 from Character District 2.5 to Light Industrial (“LI”) and zone Tract 2 for LI upon annexation.

I have summarized these requests in Figure 1 below. In accordance with San Marcos policy, I met with City staff for a pre-development meeting on September 8, 2025. This letter replaces the letter dated September 17, 2025.

Pedernales Electric Cooperative (“PEC”) for electricity. Ultimately, information on water service and electricity consumption will be finalized through the site development process and will be subject to CCSUD, PEC, and Lower Colorado River Authority (“LCRA”) approval.

Additionally, the Owners have worked to answer concerns related to utility service, including proposing a restrictive covenant that would limit water usage to 235 LUEs – which would cut the water usage approved for the Property today roughly in half. The Owners are also committed to fully complying with a new state law, Senate Bill 6, which regulates data center development and energy use throughout Texas. (For reference, the Lone Star Chapter of the Sierra Club supported the passage of Senate Bill 6.)

Among other provisions, this new law sets cost-sharing and disclosure requirements intended to support ERCOT’s efforts to plan for grid reliability and to deter speculation. Critically, the law also provides greater authority for ERCOT to reduce energy to new large-load users during emergencies. As ERCOT’s CEO, Pablo Vegas, stated in an interview with Hearst Newspapers: “If a data center connects onto our [ERCOT’s] grid and the grid gets tight, they have to turn off before we (have rotating outages.”

- **Environmental.** The Owners are not aware of any floodplain or other environmentally sensitive features impacting the Property, and the Property is not located in the ‘Environmental Overlay’ shown in Vision SMTX. Through this process, the Owners are proposing to annex the Property into San Marcos, which will provide greater protections than are otherwise afforded in the ETJ.

Additionally, the Owners have proposed a restrictive covenant that would commit the Property to superior environmental standards, including provisions related to impervious cover, stormwater runoff, green building, and sound limits (as discussed in more detail below).

- **Cemetery.** There is a cemetery (the Nichols Cemetery) located on a parcel of land that is surrounded by Tract 1. The applicants do not own this cemetery parcel. State law (Section 711.041 of the Texas Health and Safety Code) provides public access rights to any such cemeteries, stating that: “Any person who wishes to visit a cemetery or private burial grounds for which no public ingress or egress is available shall have the right to reasonable ingress and egress for the purpose of visiting the cemetery or private burial grounds.”

Highlander SM One, LLC also previously hired a licensed Texas geoscientist to perform a ground-penetrating radar study of the area *around* the cemetery to determine if there were any other burials in the general vicinity of the cemetery. This study determined that “the current limits of the cemetery have been preserved throughout history” and that “the surveyed outer buffer zone [around the cemetery] lacks evidence suggestive of human burials”

- **Fiscal Responsibility.** The Vision SMTX Comprehensive Plan prioritizes development patterns that have a positive fiscal impact, with new revenues balanced against long-term responsibilities for providing City services and maintaining City infrastructure. While a data center use will generate meaningful new tax revenues, it will have only limited needs for City services – and thus will have a positive fiscal impact. In contrast, the previous proposal for this Property – a roughly 470-unit single-family subdivision – would generate a higher demand for City services for things like police, fire, emergency services, transportation infrastructure, and parkland, among other things.

Based on similar data center projects in Texas, we estimate roughly \$4 million in annual revenues for the City and \$7 million to San Marcos ISD.

- **Compatibility.** The Property is directly adjacent to a power plant (which the City has designated for the Commercial/Employment Low Place Type and for Heavy Industrial zoning). A data center project on the Property would be more compatible with this existing power plant use than a large single-family subdivision project.

Restrictive Covenant

The Owners have worked collaboratively to incorporate feedback and improve their proposal. As part of this effort, the Owners have proposed a binding restrictive covenant that would commit the Property to the following, regardless of ownership:

- **Limiting Water Use.** Any data center on the Property will not exceed 235 LUEs or 75,000 gallons per day of water usage (for reference, the single-family subdivision plan at this site is approved for up to 550 LUEs).
- **Improving Drainage.** The data center development must reduce the stormwater runoff rate on the Property by 10 percent below the pre-construction runoff rate for the 2-year, 10-year, 25-year, and 100-year storms.
- **Lowering Impervious Cover.** The restrictive covenant would limit impervious cover on the Property to 70 percent – lower than what the Light Industrial zoning designation would otherwise allow (80 percent).
- **Superior Building Standards.** The owner must seek Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification for any data center development on the Property.
- **Restricting Sound.** The restrictive covenant would limit sound to 75 decibels throughout the day and evening, which is a more restrictive standard that required in the City of San Marcos Development Code.
- **Restricting Uses.** The restrictive covenant would prohibit warehouse and distribution and waste-related service uses, which would otherwise be allowed in the Light Industrial zoning district.

Case Rationale

We believe that these requests are appropriate, reasonable, and consistent with the City's goals and with good planning and land use practices. Specifically, we believe that:

- **The Owners have worked collaboratively to put forward an environmentally superior proposal** that limits water use, improves drainage, and provides superior building standards, among other things (as discussed above).
- **A data center use will produce new tax revenues with limited need for City services.** As noted above, a data center use will produce meaningful new tax revenues while having only limited

needs for City services such as police, fire, emergency services, transportation infrastructure, and parkland, among other things. As a result, such a project would be a major fiscal benefit for the City budget and for taxpayers.

- **A data center use will have a lower traffic footprint and produce less ‘wear and tear’ on roads.** The Property is currently connected to the rest of the City via one roadway, Francis Harris Lane. Thus, any traffic entering or exiting the Property will largely be concentrated on that one road. Higher-volume uses would generate greater congestion and ‘wear and tear’ for the City to manage, in contrast to the lower traffic footprint of a data center.
- **This is the right location for a data center use, from a planning perspective.** Data center uses often require large tracts of land that an owner can readily secure against unauthorized access and that are not vulnerable to environmental hazards or other such features. These characteristics generally mean that properties on the edge of the City are likelier to be appropriate for a data center use. Given this dynamic, other data center developments have been proposed in areas *outside* the City limits. Such projects would not be subject to the City’s environmental regulations and would not contribute to the City’s tax base. In contrast, this proposal would meet a higher environmental standard while also paying City taxes.

Prior Cases

In December 2024, the Owners submitted applications for annexation, Preferred Scenario Map Amendment, and zoning related to the Property, with the goal of developing the Property for a data center use.

On March 25, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment and zoning cases. While the Owners requested that the Planning and Zoning Commission postpone the cases to allow additional time to address concerns, the Commission ultimately proceeded and recommended denial of both cases on an 8-1 vote.

At its August 19, 2025 regularly scheduled Council meeting (which concluded after midnight on August 20), Council took the following actions related to those cases:

- Council voted 7-0 in favor of the annexation request on first reading only. This case was later postponed as the associated Preferred Scenario Map Amendment and zoning cases failed to proceed (as described below).
- Council voted 5-2 in favor of the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment request. However, as Section 2.4.2.3.C.3. of the Development Code required a super-majority vote of Council in order to approve this application, the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment did not proceed.

(Importantly, the Development Code distinguishes between applications that are denied versus those that fail to achieve a super-majority threshold. Section 2.2.4.2.A. of the Development Code, which defines how the City administers the super-majority requirement, specifies that applications that fail to earn the requisite super-majority vote do “not become effective” – it does not describe the application as being denied. Specifically, that provision states: “Development applications where a super majority vote is required by this development code **shall not become effective** [emphasis added] except by the favorable vote of six members of the City Council.”)

- Council took no action on the zoning request, since the associated Preferred Scenario Map Amendment failed to proceed.

We have likewise reviewed the relevant portions of the Development Code and concluded that the Owners have the right to submit the attached applications at this time. Our analysis of the relevant provisions is provided below:

- **General Re-Application Provision.** Section 2.3.4.1.A. of the Development Code specifies that “Whenever any development application, with the exception of any plat application, is denied at a public hearing for failure to meet the substantive requirements of this Development Code, a development application for all or a part of the same property shall not be accepted for filing for a period of six months from the date of denial unless the subsequent application involves a proposal that is materially different from the previously denied proposal.”

Council did not vote to deny any of the cases related to the Property. However, as Section 2.4.2.3.C.3. of the Development Code required a super-majority vote of Council in order to approve this application, the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment did not proceed. This action is distinct and different from a denial, which would have required a motion and a second to deny the application and an affirmative vote of a majority of Council in favor of denial.

Furthermore, Section 2.3.4.1.A. only applies to development applications that were “denied at a public hearing for failure to meet the substantive requirements of this Development Code.” None of the applications “fail[ed] to meet the substantive requirements of this Development Code.”

As a result, Section 2.3.4.1.A. does not apply to the attached applications.

- **Preferred Scenario Map Amendments.** Section 2.4.2.2. of the Development Code specifies that “Consideration of Preferred Scenario Map amendments that are modifications to a Neighborhood Low-Existing Place Type shall be limited to twice per year as determined by the Responsible Official.” The City has designated the Property for Conservation/Cluster, not Neighborhood Low-Existing.

As a result, Section 2.4.2.2. does not apply to the attached applications.

- **Zoning.** Section 2.5.1.2.F.1. prohibits the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council from considering a zoning application for a property within a year of any of the following:
 - “A City Council vote to deny the same requested change for all or any portion of the parcel.”
 - “Withdrawal of the same requested change by the applicant after the City Council meeting at which the change is to be considered has been called to order.”
 - “A modification to the boundary of the same requested change by the applicant after the Planning and Zoning Commission has voted on the matter.”

The Owners proceeded to Council for a vote on the zoning application and did not modify the case boundaries. Ultimately, as the Preferred Scenario Map Amendment case did not proceed, Council took no action on the association zoning case.

As a result, Section 2.5.1.2.F.1. does not apply to the attached applications.

We discussed this information with the City, which agreed with our interpretation of these code provisions and with our analysis that the Owners have the right to submit the attached applications at this time

Conclusion

We believe that this request is reasonable, that our proposal will help the City achieve superior policy outcomes on issues like environmental sustainability and fiscal responsibility, and that the Property is an appropriate location for a data center development.

We appreciate your consideration – and I am available to discuss this case further and answer questions.

Attachment A: Fiscal Analysis

As part of its Vision SMTX planning process, the City considered how different development patterns affect both “the estimated revenues generated by new development” and “the estimated costs of public services required to serve that development,” with the goal of ensuring that the City grows in a fiscally responsible and sustainable manner.

In short, the City generally prioritizes development patterns that balance new tax revenues against the long-term costs of public services (for infrastructure, policing, fire and emergency services, and more). Development patterns that produce greater tax revenues than they demand in public services will help support the City’s fiscal sustainability over the long term.

By this metric, a data center is a prudent choice at this location. When compared to the most recent proposed use of this site (single-family subdivision), a data center will have a lower overall need for City services while producing meaningful tax revenues.

As noted above, the Property is located on the edge of San Marcos’ city limits and is connected to the rest of the City by a single roadway, Francis Harris Lane. This site context has several important implications for fiscal sustainability:

- **Property Location.** First, the Property’s location at the edge of the city limits means that development patterns which demand higher levels of City services will stress City resources over time. Vision SMTX notes that outlying development that demands higher levels of police, fire, and emergency services coverage can lengthen response times and generate the need for more facilities and personnel. Location can also affect other important City services; for instance, outlying residential development in areas without existing amenities often adds pressure for the City to develop and maintain new parkland, which can spread parks resources out more thinly over a larger parks system.

Data centers require less police, fire, and emergency services coverage than single-family subdivisions – and have little to no impact on other City services like parks and open space.

Given the sensitive nature of data centers – as well as the large amount of expensive technology that they hold – owners operate their own on-site security, which deters crime and reduces the need for police services; they also invest in fire suppression systems to protect their investment. In contrast, even in safe and secure subdivisions, residents often expect their City to ensure a certain level of police presence, and the large volume of households increases the probability that one or more will likely require fire or emergency services at some point.

Likewise, residents often expect their City to invest in parks and other recreational amenities near their homes. This becomes particularly important in outlying areas without easy access to existing parkland, pressuring the City to acquire and develop new parks spaces that ultimately serve a limited number of households. Data centers produce no such demand, allowing the City to use its resources to maintain and improve its existing parks system without stressing existing resources.

Finally, as described above, the project intends to use CCSUD for water service and PEC for electricity, and thus will not require City service for either utility.

- **Limited Connectivity.** Second, the limited connectivity to the City means that traffic traveling to and from the Property will largely be concentrated on one roadway (Francis Harris Lane); higher-volume uses would result in greater ‘wear and tear’ on this roadway and will require more maintenance and more frequent replacement.

Data centers produce very little traffic compared to other uses. Residential subdivisions generally feature a large volume of morning and evening commuting, in addition to trips to grocery stores, libraries, friends’ homes, and more. Commercial uses generally operate by attracting as many customers as possible. Industrial uses often feature heavy trucks dropping off and picking up various materials. Data centers, instead, feature none of these dynamics. They are secure facilities that feature fewer people than a residential subdivision and generally do not attract outside visitors. As a result, data centers have a meaningfully lower impact on roadway infrastructure and maintenance.

For reference, the Urban Land Institute, a respected land-use think tank, has reported that data centers “require fewer employees to operate than most other commercial properties, leaving minimal impacts on traffic in surrounding areas.”

The other major consideration related to fiscal sustainability is the Property’s ability to produce tax revenues that can help cover the costs of the services described above.

While single-family subdivisions often generate new tax revenues, they also meaningfully increase demand for City services. Vision SMTX notes that development patterns similar to that previously proposed for this Property (a 470-unit single-family subdivision) have the “the “Highest cost to serve (per new person) of all Place Types” and “generates [the] largest increase in new streets to maintain.”¹

Data centers, instead, often produce meaningful new property tax revenues – buoyed by the types of improvements needed to house expensive computing technology – while generating a *lower* demand on City services. While Vision SMTX found that the Commercial/Employment Low Place Type (the designation requested for the Property) generally has a negative fiscal impact it also caveated this finding by specifying that the “value of non-residential development will vary fiscal impact” and that “[i]mpact on calls for service varies by use (e.g. retail more, industrial less).” In this case, as demonstrated above, the data center use in particular has a *positive* fiscal impact, producing meaningful new revenues with only a limited need for City services.

A briefing in the American Planning Association’s *Zoning Practice* publication sums up the comparison between the previous proposed use (single-family subdivision) and the current proposed use (data center) concisely, stating that data centers can be “highly desirable from an economic development perspective because they often generate a large property tax surplus that can subsidize more service-intensive land uses, such as single-family homes.”

¹ Technically, the Preferred Scenario Map currently designates the Property for Conservation/Cluster, which primarily consists of parks, open space, and agricultural or ranchland. However, Vision SMTX notes that Conservation/Cluster actually “has the potential to perform like a Neighborhood Low or Medium Place Type if a cluster-style development is pursued.” In this case, the Property has most recently been planned for a new subdivision consisting of an estimated 470 detached single-family homes, a development pattern that more closely reflects the Neighborhood Low-New Place Type (primary land use: detached single-family).

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ERCOT CEO: No data center, worries

Power-hungry facilities will disconnect during severe grid emergencies, he says

An unprecedented surge of data centers could be coming to Texas, prompting concerns over how the state's power grid — which infamously suffered deadly blackouts in 2021 — will keep up with the breakneck de-

mand.

According to Pablo Vegas, CEO of the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, residents don't need to be alarmed: A new state law requires data centers to disconnect in phases at the grid operator's discretion during a severe grid emergency.

"If a data center connects onto

our grid and the grid gets tight, they have to turn off before we (have rotating outages)," Vegas said in a recent interview with Hearst Newspapers.

As Big Tech companies race to develop artificial intelligence, a huge pipeline of data centers — some planning to use as much electricity as entire cities — are seeking to come to Texas, attracted to the state's plentiful land and relatively cheap energy for industrial customers.

As a result, near-term electricity demand is expected to grow magnitudes faster in Texas than anywhere else in the country, according to an Energy Department analysis.

Even if many of the data centers proposed for Texas aren't ultimately built, ERCOT has forecast that electricity demand across its system could increase 70% by 2031.

"It's really been just something that we've never experi-

enced before in the history of ERCOT," Vegas said.

The Trump administration has embraced Big Tech's AI push, arguing that the United States has to outcompete adversaries such as China in developing the potentially transformative technology.

Recently, Gov. Greg Abbott appeared alongside Google's CEO as the tech giant announced \$40 billion in AI-relat-

ed investments across the state, which would make Texas home to more Google data centers than anywhere else in the world.

But in welcoming data centers, Texas leaders — particularly Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick — have also raised concerns about how the influx could jeopardize the state's power grid.

Those concerns manifested in Senate Bill 6, a law Abbott signed in June that received some push-back from the data center industry.

Much of the debate focused on a first-of-its-kind requirement that data centers and other non-critical industrial facilities would have to shut off if ERCOT ordered rotating outages. In 2021, these outages only affected everyday residents and businesses.

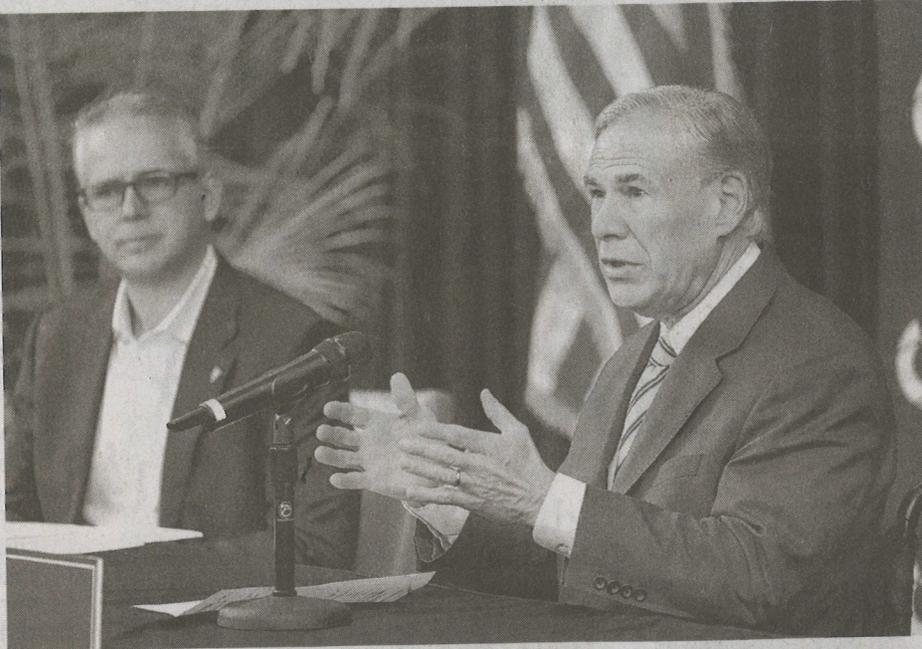
Reducing reliance

But, according to Vegas, the new law goes further than that.

ERCOT will have the authority to ask data centers to reduce their reliance on the grid before it ever reaches the point of needing to order rotating outages, he said.

At first, the requests would be voluntary, and data centers would get 24-hour notice and payments for participating.

But if grid conditions continued to deteriorate, the requests would become mandatory: Data centers with on-site backup power would be required to switch to their own resources or cut back

on electricity consumption, Vegas said.

If ERCOT exhausted nearly all of its other tools to prevent rotating outages, it would be allowed to tell data centers with significant backup power to disconnect from the grid, Vegas said.

Thus, ERCOT doesn't

have to worry that there won't be enough new power plants built in the coming years to meet projected data center demand, Vegas said, because those facilities would have to be flexible in their power consumption during a grid emergency.

"That effectively means that all of this new growth that's coming cannot contribute to the grid going into (rotating outages). It has to all come off before," Vegas said. "That was an unlock for the state of Texas, to be able to say we can accommodate the growth that's coming."

Power bottleneck

Though the new law has "solved" the supply-and-demand issue, data center growth is still constrained by how quickly long-distance power lines can be built across Texas, Vegas said.

In total, Texas could need \$33 billion in new transmission lines, ERCOT estimated, which would be the largest expansion of the state's electrical network since 2013. The cost of these projects would be spread out among all ERCOT cus-

tomers across the state.

ERCOT has already approved a few big-ticket transmission projects: a \$13.8 billion network in West Texas, as well as a \$9.4 billion grid "super-highway" cutting through the Houston area.

But new transmission projects take years to build, slower than new data centers can be constructed.

It's possible that in the coming years, parts of the grid could become saturated. That would slow down connecting new data centers to the grid in that region until the local utility can build more power lines, Vegas said.

The Texas power industry's challenge is to figure out how to build transmission lines quickly, he said — at the same time that local communities across Texas are already beginning to protest huge power-line projects.

Looking ahead to this winter, Vegas said "the grid is probably in the most reliable condition that it's been in since Winter Storm Uri," also known as the February 2021 freeze.

That's because ERCOT has added a lot more electricity supply since that storm and Texas hasn't yet seen the massive electricity demand growth that's forecast for the next couple of years, he said.

And in the longer term, ERCOT won't accept more data centers than the grid is able to handle, Vegas said.

"We're not going to allow the grid to grow to a capacity where it can't be operated reliably," he said.

National Data Center Moratorium Now!

Dear Members of Congress:

We, the undersigned organizations collectively representing millions of people in all 50 states, call on you to support a national moratorium on the approval and construction of new data centers.

The rapid expansion of data centers across the United States, driven by the generative artificial intelligence (AI) and crypto boom, presents one of the biggest environmental and social threats of our generation. This expansion is rapidly increasing demand for energy, driving more fossil fuel pollution, straining water resources and raising electricity prices across the country. All this compounds the significant and concerning impacts AI is having on society, including lost jobs, social instability and economic concentration.

The harms of data center growth are increasingly well-established, and they are massive. They include:

- Enormous electricity consumption: A tripling of data centers in the next five years would result in data centers consuming as much electricity as about 30 million households.
- Unsustainable water consumption: A tripling of data centers would require as much water as is used by 18.5 million households – simply for cooling the computer servers.
- Contribution to climate change: 56 percent of the electricity used to power data centers is sourced from fossil fuels.
- Skyrocketing electricity costs: Electricity rates have increased 21.3 percent from 2021 to 2024 – drastically outpacing inflation – driven largely by the rapid build-out of data centers, something that could continue to escalate over time.
- Job losses: According to an AI executive, AI could negate half of all entry-level white-collar jobs in the next five years and spike overall unemployment by up to 20 percent.

The rapid, largely unregulated rise of data centers to fuel the AI and crypto frenzy is disrupting communities across the country and threatening Americans' economic, environmental, climate and water security. We urge you to join our call for a national moratorium on new data centers until adequate regulations can be enacted to fully protect our communities, our families, our environment and our health from the runaway damage this industry is already inflicting.

Hello Planning and Zoning members,

I watched the P&Z meeting 12-9-25. You are having to do very difficult work, and some of the responses to your questions seemed to be lacking some specificity. In terms of the total water use that data centers extract through direct use internally and indirect use from energy production at thermal plants, (gas or nuclear), I wanted to provide you with additional information.

Water use for production of energy is a real concern for the proposed data center. Since they are estimating 4 buildings, we can assume that this data center will be a 400 MW demand (generally built in 100 MW/building). According to the 2025 Texas Water Development Board 10-year Regional Water plan, 0.25 gallons of water is needed to cool a thermal power plant for each kwh it generates. For a 400 MW plant running 24 hours a day, this would be $400 \text{ MW} \times 1000 \text{ kw/MW} \times 24 \text{ hours} \times 0.25 \text{ gal/kwh} = 2.4$ Million gallons/day to cool the power plant that powers the data center. Plus the 75,000 gallons/day to cool the equipment in the data center. So each of you with water use questions is correct to be concerned.

When it comes to water, the City of San Marcos, Crystal Clear and the Hays Energy Plant get their water from the same sources: GBRA with the primary source (50% for San Marcos) from Canyon Lake. So it is important because they may be 3 different entities, but rely on the same source of water. See below for supporting documents:

What are the power sources for PEC? LCRA and solar and wind assets. LCRA power plant is located in LaGrange and outside of the GBRA watershed.

I think an important “Ask” of this project is that the data center commit to using PEC as the source of power for a very long-term period (20-30 years). My real concern is that the data center owners and designers will find it “more efficient” to buy power directly from the Hays Energy plant once approval is granted to build from the City of San Marcos. Likewise, Hays Energy has a capacity of 900 MW and may find it economically more feasible to sell directly to one source rather than add power to the grid to be overseen by ERCOT. Power from the Hays Energy Plant means water from the GBRA water sources at 2.4 million gallons/day for a 400 MW generation rate. This will reduce water from the sources that Crystal Clear and the City of San Marcos get drinking water from.

The city of San Marcos provides 1.6 Million Gallons a day of reclaimed water (Utility Director Tyler Hjorth) to Hays Energy for cooling. This is all they have at this point with other sources going to Texas State and Kissing Tree. Data centers have a tendency to expand their size of operations once built and this would place an even higher water demand on the power generation and power plant water needs.

City staff, Mark Enders, the Habitat Conservation Coordinator [REDACTED] is very familiar with the critically low water levels in Canyon Lake, and the Edwards Aquifer and the low flows in the San Marcos River. Robert Mace with the Meadows Center [REDACTED] is also very knowledgeable about our limited water supplies and could provide valuable insight. Reaching out to these two gentlemen, could give you all needed insight on this side of the decision process.

In my opinion, if controls are put into place to 1) require the data center to report at least monthly on its average daily water use 2) limit the internal water use to the proposed 75,000 gallons, and 3) prohibit the data center from utilizing the adjacent power plant for its energy source (i.e. commit to PEC as proposed), then the project impact on the City's drinking water sources can be minimized.

Thank you for considering these thoughts.

RESTRICTIVE COVENANT AGREEMENT

THIS RESTRICTIVE COVENANT AGREEMENT (this "**Agreement**") is made and entered into as of the _____ day of _____, 20____, by and between Highlander SM One, LLC, a Texas limited liability company ("**Highlander**"), and Donald W. Tuff and Germaine Tuff ("**Tuffs**", and together with Highlander, the "**Owner**"), and the City of San Marcos, Texas (the "**City**").

RECITALS:

A. Highlander is the owner of a tract of land totaling approximately 135.912 acres situated in Hays County, Texas, more particularly described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto, and the Tuffs are the owner of a tract of land totaling approximately 63.578 acres situated in Hays County, Texas, more particularly described in Exhibit "A-1", attached hereto (collectively, the "**Property**").

B. Owner submitted an application to the City on September 17, 2025 for the rezoning of the Property to Light Industrial pursuant to Zoning Request ZC-25-02 (the "**Zoning Case**").

C. A data center is expected to be built on the Property. For purposes of this Agreement, a "data center" is a property classification, which means a building or buildings primarily used to house computer systems and associated components, such as telecommunications and storage system.

D. The City has required this Agreement in connection with the Zoning Case in order to permit the development of a data center on the Property, and the Owner desires to subject the Property to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00), and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which the parties hereby acknowledge, the Owner and the City do hereby agree as follows:

1. Establishment of Restrictive Covenant. All of the recitals above are incorporated herein. The Parties hereto agree and acknowledge that the Property shall be held, sold, transferred, conveyed and occupied subject to the following:

(A) The following uses and activities are prohibited on the Property:

- (i) Warehouse and Distribution*
- (ii) Waste-Related Service*

** As such uses are defined in the 2025 San Marcos Development Code.*

(B) If a data center is constructed on the Property, the data center will utilize a closed-loop, non-evaporative cooling system or similar system to cool the technology assets in the

data center. Regardless, water usage at the data center will not exceed 235 LUEs or 75,000 gallons per day.

(C) If a data center is constructed on the Property, drainage facilities shall be designed and constructed so that the rate of runoff from a site after construction shall be ten percent (10%) less than the runoff prior to construction for the two (2), ten (10), twenty five (25), and one hundred (100) year storm frequencies.

(D) If a data center is constructed on the Property, water quality facilities will be constructed that meet a Total Suspended Solid (TSS) removal requirement of at least 80% for the site.

(E) If a data center is constructed on the Property, the impervious cover for a data center will be no more than 70% of the Property.

(F) If a data center is constructed on the Property, Owner will pursue a LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification for the buildings within twelve (12) months from the date of the final certificate of occupancy and commissioning of building systems for the last building to be constructed on the Property and a copy of the submitted application will be made available to the City of San Marcos for inspection.

(G) If a data center is constructed on the Property, then the noise level maximums set forth in Section 7.4.2.1(A) of the City of San Marcos Land Development Code as in effect on the date hereof shall be 75 decibels as measured from either the closest public right-of-way to the Property or from the property line of the complainant per Section 7.4.2.1(B) of the City of San Marcos Land Development Code in effect on the date hereof.

(H) If a data center is constructed on the Property, during construction the following requirements will be met and reasonable signage on the jobsite in both English and Spanish will list these standards:

- Compliance with all relevant local, state, and federal safety laws;
- All construction workers on the project will be paid by check or direct deposit, or other commercially used payment method, including electronic or other payment methods that are customary in the industry;
- All construction workers on the project will be covered by workers' compensation insurance as required by state or federal law;
- All construction workers on the project will receive personal protective equipment, free of charge if not already provided by the employer as required by state or federal law;
- All safety supervisors on the project will be current on their 30-hour, OSHA approved construction worker safety class prior to commencing construction work as

required by state or federal law.

2. **Remedies.** The City and Owner may pursue any remedies available at law or in equity to enforce the provisions of this Agreement, including the recovery of reasonable attorney's fees and court costs.

3. **No Waiver.** The failure of the City or Owner to avail itself of any of the privileges, rights, covenants, agreements, terms and conditions of this Agreement for any period of time or at any time shall not be construed or deemed to be a waiver thereof, and nothing herein contained, nor anything done or omitted to be done by the City or Owner pursuant hereto, shall be deemed a waiver by the other of any of its rights and remedies hereunder or under the laws of the State of Texas. The enforcement of any right or remedy hereunder by the City, either prior to, simultaneously with, or subsequent to any other action taken hereunder, shall not be deemed an election of remedies.

4. **Modification.** This Agreement may not be modified or amended unless such modification or amendment has been reduced to writing approved by the city council of the City and signed by all of the then-existing owners of the Property or portions thereof, and by the City, and has been recorded in the Official Public Records of Hays County, Texas.

5. **Binding Effect.** The obligations created hereunder shall create mutual benefits and servitudes running with the land. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors, heirs and assigns.

6. **Partial Invalidity.** If any provision of this Agreement shall be or become invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect under any applicable law, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected or impaired thereby.

7. **Term.** Unless earlier terminated as provided herein, this Agreement shall be in effect for a period of twenty (20) years from the date hereof, i.e. this Agreement shall expire on the 20th anniversary of the date of this Agreement set forth above. Upon expiration of the twenty (20) year term, this Agreement shall automatically expire and be of no further force or effect.

8. **Misc. Provisions.** This Agreement may only be enforced by the Owner and the City. The City may not assign this Agreement. Owner may assign this Agreement. There are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement. Upon Owner's request and within thirty (30) days of the request, the City agrees to provide Owner written confirmation that Owner is not in violation of any provision in this Agreement. If as part of that written confirmation the City believes Owner is not in compliance with any provision, City will state with specificity the details related to the lack of compliance and specifically how Owner does not comply. Lenders and Tenants may rely on City's confirmation.

9. **Chapter 245.** This Agreement establishes vested rights of Owner pursuant to Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code.

10. **Condition Precedent.** It is a condition precedent to the effectiveness of this Agreement that the rezoning of the Property pursuant to the Zoning Case has been fully and finally approved by the San Marcos City Council on or before March 18, 2026. If such rezoning is not

fully and finally approved by the San Marcos City Council by such date for any reason, then this Agreement shall expire on such date and thereafter shall be of no force or effect.

11. Default. If any party defaults under this Agreement, then the non-defaulting party will not exercise any remedies for such default unless the defaulting party fails to cure such breach within thirty (30) days following the non-defaulting party's delivery of written notice of such breach to the defaulting party by hand delivery or overnight mail; provided, however, that if the particular default cannot reasonably be cured within thirty (30) days, then such 30-day cure period will be extended for up to two (2) additional thirty (30) day periods to allow the defaulting party a reasonable opportunity to cure its breach, so long as the defaulting party commences the required cure within such 30-day period and thereafter diligently pursues the same to completion.

12. No Dedication. Nothing in this Agreement shall ever constitute or be construed as a dedication of any interest herein described to the public or give any member of the public any right whatsoever.

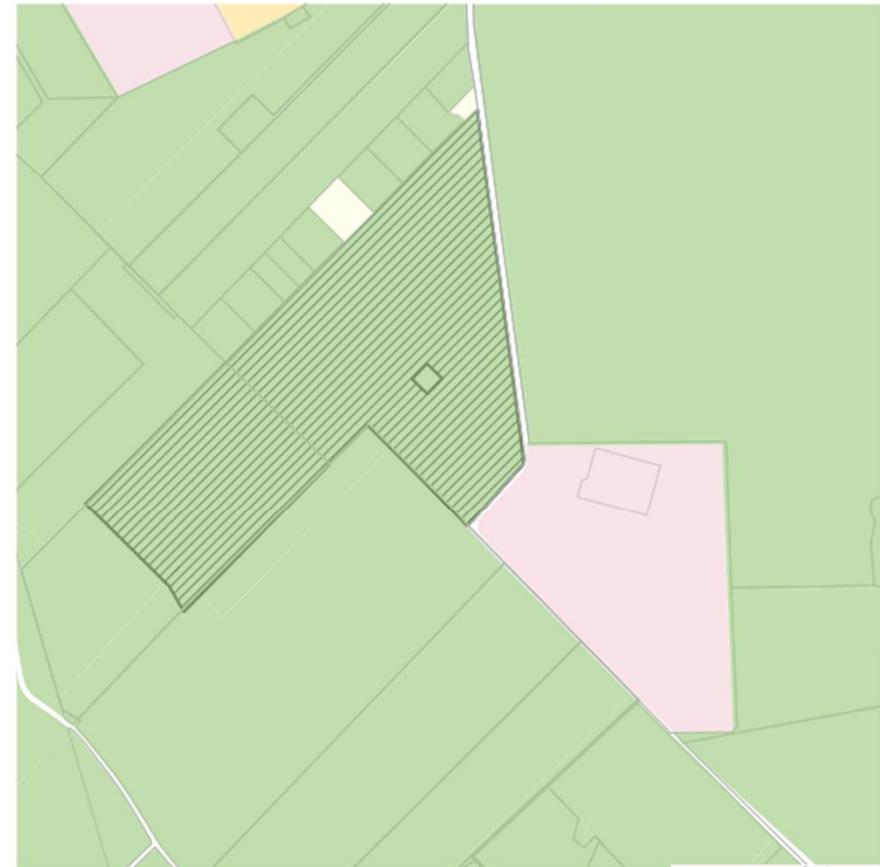

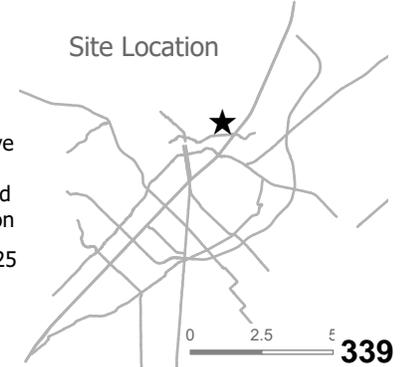
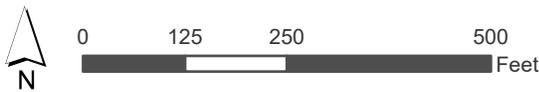
Figure 112: SMFD 8-Minute Effective Response Force
