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Property Tax Rate Definitions




- <u>No-New-Revenue Rate (NNR</u>) = 59.96¢: tax rate that will produce the same amount of revenue as the previous fiscal year on properties taxed in both years
- Proposed Budget Rate = 60.30¢: tax rate used to prepare the FY 2025 Proposed Budget
- <u>Current Rate</u> = 60.30¢: tax rate used for current fiscal year
- <u>Voter-Approval Rate</u> = 70.36¢: tax rate that increases the operation component of the NNR by 3.5%, plus the debt rate, plus any unused increment from the prior 3 years

 Exceeding this rate triggers an automatic election



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

Setting the Property Tax Rate Process



- City Council set the maximum proposed tax rate
 - August 20, 2024
 - Establishes a ceiling for next fiscal year's tax rate
- Tax Rate Public Hearings
 - September 3, 2024
 - September 17, 2024
- City Council sets the FY 2025 tax rate
 - September 17, 2024
 - May be equal to or lower than the maximum proposed tax rate

Recommendation



- Staff recommends no increase to the current tax rate
- City Council set the maximum proposed tax rate to the current tax rate at 60.30¢
- Schedule the dates of September 3rd and September 17th to hold public hearings on the tax rate
