Consider approval of Resolution 2025-188R, approving an On-Call Professional Services agreement with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc., for the Transportation Master Plan Update Project in the estimated amount of \$900,000.00; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the agreement on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
- 2. Consider approval of Resolution 2025-189R, approving a change order to the agreement with Jerdon Enterprise LP, for the Sessom Creek Bank Stabilization and Wastewater Replacement Project in the amount of \$195,937.17 for a total contract price of \$2,934,454.14; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the change order on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
- 3. Consider approval of Resolution 2025-190R, authorizing a request for reimbursement

from the Texas Department of Transportation ("TXDOT") for 95 percent of the cost of the Runway 17-35 and 13-31 Improvements and Decoupling Design Project for the San Marcos Regional Airport in the estimated amount of \$1,425,000.00 out of the estimated project cost of \$1,500,000.00; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute all contracts and agreements with TXDOT as necessary to obtain such reimbursement and to execute a Designation of Sponsor's Authorized Representative on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.

- 4. Consider approval of Resolution 2025-191R, approving the San Marcos Regional Airport Master Plan to guide the Airport's future development and operations; and declaring an effective date.
- 5. Consider approval of Resolution 2025-192R, approving the award of an Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract to TCS Mechanical, LLC, for plumbing maintenance services for the Public Works Department in the estimated annual amount of \$200,000.00 with the option for up to three one-year renewals for a total estimated contract price of \$800,000.00; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the contract and any renewals on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
- 6. Consider approval of Resolution 2025-193R, expressing support for an Interlocal Agreement between the Great Springs Project and the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) for a CAMPO transportation alternatives grant to develop a study for a shared use path or trail along Hunter Road from San Marcos to the Hays/Comal County Line, with zero cost to the city; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute documents evidencing support for the agreement on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.

Consider approval of Resolution 2025-194R, approving a sole source contract with Tyler Technologies Inc., for the purchase of ticket writer support and maintenance services in the estimated amount of \$46,462.59 for one year and the option of up to four additional one-year renewals, with a five percent increase each additional year for a total contract amount of \$256,735.10; authorizing the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the contract and any renewals on behalf of the city; and declaring an effective date.
