#### PARD Scholarships Program

#### **Project Summary:**

The goal for this year's CDBG application is to continue our existing program that provides fee scholarships for low/mod income families. Last year, we reduced the total amount per child from \$250 to \$150 to increase the number of children participating in PARD recreational programs during the year. We believe having the families contribute 50% of the fee creates more "buy-in" from the participants when they have funds invested.

We are requesting funding to continue the program at the same level as last year (\$12,750). We expect to serve 125 children. The target population is children of low-income families who live within the city limits of San Marcos. We also offer the scholarships to any child who attends SMCISD. This scholarship program allows families who might not otherwise be able to send their children

This year's scholarship program will continue to provide half of costs, up to \$150 per child, to be used for any of the 29 fee-based PARD Recreational and Out-of-School Programs. The parents choose one or more activities and pay half of the cost per child, up to \$150.

The scholarship being offered can be used for PARD Recreational and Out-of-School programs such as: Summer Fun, Jr. NBA and WNBA Basketball, Fall and Summer Slam Volleyball, Swim Lessons, Flag Football, Snake League Soccer, Pre-Engineering with LEGO, River Rats Nature Camp, Afternoon Drop-Off Program, Creature Crawl, Fin and Feather Camp, and Mayhem Camp.

Examples of a PARD scholarship eligible programs are: (a) Summer Fun at \$250 for eight weeks, (b) Flag Football at the new 5-Mile Dam Soccer Complex at \$40 for 7 weeks, and (c) San Marcos Youth Baseball/Softball at \$80 per child for 10 weeks. Eligible families will pay ½ of that fee and the scholarship will pay the remainder.
