Typographical, grammatical, and stylistic corrections:

- List each typo change you made here. I did two for you. Please do the rest:
- Page 64. “Motivations” was uncapitalized.
- Page 26. Space added between “Drive” and “and”
- Odd numbers are on the right for the Plan
- Page 29. Street Names are legible and readable, and Map has the street names moved off the centerlines. (The version of the plan available to council has been optimized to make it easier to download, so maps are not as crisp as the final version)
- New Photos of artwork have been added to pg. 19.
- Pg. 20, “such as” included to fragmented sentence
- Page 20. And 21, (See page 25) added to two sentences for clarity
- Changed 8 instances of façade to facade

The photo of the Sessom Drive mural has been replaced with other images in all instances throughout the plan.

Page 2 and 3, Vie Lofts and the no longer active businesses, has been replaced with the N. LBJ Drive Guitar Mural.

Page 5, List of Figures and Tables added

Page 24, GA 1.1: Rewritten to remove “Live Oak Street,” and replaced with “unnamed small unimproved gravel right-of-way alley.”
