- Right-of-way use










Corridor Concepts (N/S Connector)

CATALYST DEVELOPMENT MODELS

- Three (3) sites analyzed:
 - **Downtown (Guadalupe St.)**
 - **Medical Center (SH 123)**
 - **City Government Complex (Hopkins St./SH 80)**
- Based on financial analysis and market feasibility
- Study presents potential build-out scenarios, related transportation improvements, and an estimate of fiscal impacts due to the developments
