RESOLUTION NO. 2023-98R

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS, TEXAS ENDING THE DECLARATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER IN THE CITY DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECITALS:

- **1.** Mayor Jane Hughson declared a local state of disaster in San Marcos, Texas on March 15, 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **2.** Pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code the City Council continued the declaration by Resolution No. 2020-74R on March 20, 2020, until such time as ended by subsequent resolution of the City Council.
- **3.** On April 10, 2023, President Biden signed a bill ending the national emergency related to COVID-19.
- **4.** On April 15, 2023, Texas Governor Greg Abbott signed a proclamation renewing the state disaster declaration related to the COVID-19 pandemic citing as justifications the need to continue prohibiting local governments from imposing restrictions like mask mandates and vaccine mandates.
- **5.** Based on the foregoing, there is no longer a need to continue the declaration of a local state of disaster related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS, TEXAS:

- **PART 1.** The above Recitals are true and correct and adopted as the findings of the City Council.
- **PART 2.** The declaration of a local state of disaster made by Mayor Jane Hughson on March 15, 2020, and continued by City Council pursuant to Resolution No. 2020-74R is hereby terminated as of the delayed effective date provided in Part 3.
 - **PART 3.** This resolution will become effective as of June 30, 2023.
