History - Separate Transit Systems

- City Service "The Bus"
 - Operated by Capital Area Rural Transportation System
 - Diverse pick-up & drop-off locations (107 stops)
 - Route frequency of 30 or 60 minutes
 - Average annual ridership of 75,000
- University Service "Bobcat Shuttle"
 - Operated by Transdev
 - Focused pick-up & drop-off locations (32 stops)
 - Route frequency of 8 to 24 minutes
 - Average annual ridership of 2,000,000



History - Common Interests

- The goal is to create a seamless transit system
- Texas State is committed to improving our community & strengthening our partnership
- Provide the best transportation options for residents of San Marcos including university students
- Maximize Federal funding to advance transit objectives



Seamless Transit System Benefits

- The Seamless Transit System is inclusive of all residents
- Remove barriers to transit service for every resident
- Make it simple Coordinated marketing and public outreach
- Access to more Federal transit funding to enhance system
- Provides a bridge of good faith between the City and Texas
 State to bring the community together



Contributions to the Transit Partnership

- City of San Marcos A Direct Recipient
 - Coordinates with Federal Transit Administration (FTA), TxDOT & Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO)
 - Implements Grant Compliance Policies and Procedures
 - Maintains Fiduciary Responsibility & Grant Management Duties
- Texas State University A Voluntary Reporter
 - Began Reporting Ridership to National Transit Database in 2017
 - Has Generated \$10.8 Million of FTA 5307 STIC Grant Funds
 - FTA 5307 Small Transit Intensive City Funds "bonus"
 - C.A.R.E.S Act & American Rescue Plan Funds

Recent Progress: Framework ILA

- Framework Interlocal Agreement is substantially complete
- "Overarching Document" that memorializes the Transit Partnership for Seamless Transit System
- Focus on completing Transit Master Plan recommendations
- Details the Federal Grant funds "Split" for 2019-2023 FTA apportionments and sets process for future Federal grant funds
- Contains the Funding Agreement Template as an exhibit
- Acknowledges future Federal grant funds will be negotiated in good faith



Recent Progress: Funding Agreement Template

- Funding Agreement Template is substantially complete
- "Project Specific Document" that defines the party's responsibilities
- Contains the requirements for the University as a "Subrecipient"
- Permits the City to share Federal Funds with the University
- Includes Project Budget & Project Description (integrated in FTA grant application/award)
- University to "match" federal funds with local dollars

Current Activities

- FTA review of the Funding Agreement Template is underway
- University developing Project Budget & Description for grant application
- Working with Human Resources to hire the Transit Compliance Specialist for Subrecipient oversight
- Working with Transit Consultants to develop compliant oversight program for Subrecipient



Proposed Next Steps

- Return ILA for Council consideration July/August
- Submit Grant Application with the FTA for obligation August/September
- Return Funding Agreement for Council consideration in September/October
- Execute transit projects on behalf of the community
- Continue to assess/negotiate future grant funds
