History

- June 2018: City Council approved Resolution NO. 2018-117R (Kimley Horn Parking Program Framework Plan)
- December 2018: Parking Advisory Board (PAB) established. Charge includes providing recommendations on:
 - Parking and transportation demand management
 - Creation and management of Parking Benefit Districts
 - On-Street, Off-Street, and Permit parking regulations



Background

- April 2022: PAB approved RR 2022-01 PAB
 - Outlines Board's intent to request the City Council to authorize modifications to Chapter 82 (TRAFFIC & VEHICLES) where all parking codes resides.
- June 2022: PAB approved recommendations for revisions to Chapter 82



Ch. 82 New Sections for Ordinance

PAB recommendations for new sections in Chapter 82:

1. Create the process to establish and manage Parking Benefit Districts;
2. Establish and manage a Parking Mobility Fund from Parking Benefit District revenues;
3. Reference PAB in Chapter 82 (Currently referenced in Chapter 2);



Ch. 82 New Sections for Ordinance (Cont.)

PAB recommendations for new sections in Chapter 82:

4. Outline process for automatic cost of living increase to citation fees;
5. Create amnesty and incentive payment program; and
6. Authorize Parking Manager to establish fees(dynamic pricing).

PAB recommendations to revise Chapter 82:

1. Add definition for the term “Mobility”;
2. Require City’s traffic register be made publicly available on the City’s website;
3. Update Parking Citation Fee; and
4. Extend the Parking Citation Fee Schedule for citation payment.
