

Background

- In response to the Memorial Day Floods and All Saints Flood of 2015, San Marcos received a \$25M allocation from the U.S. Department of Housing (HUD).
- Substantial Change in Action Plan requires an Amendment to the Action Plan.
- 3 major changes
 - infrastructure projects,
 - o expenditures, and
 - rental housing policy.

- Action Plan 5 year lien
- Amendment Standard HOME Program Policy

\$0 to \$15,000	5 years
\$15,001 to \$40,000	10 years
More than \$40,001	15 years
Reconstruction	20 years
