**RE:** Downtown Magazine Racks

#### SUMMARY

This memorandum provides information in response to a Council Member request regarding downtown magazine racks, and opportunities to consolidate existing private racks into multivendor, modular units. The City may establish reasonable restrictions on magazine and newspaper distribution by ordinance, including the option of a City-provided consolidated magazine rack. Staff recommends developing a draft ordinance for City Council consideration.

The attached Exhibit A contains an inventory of existing magazine racks in the Main Street District. Exhibit B contains an example consolidated magazine rack and quote provided by a local vendor.

#### BACKGROUND

In March 2017, staff conducted an inventory of existing magazine racks located in the public rightof-way within the Main Street District boundary. A total of 22 individual racks were found in 7 locations, representing 11 business/organizations. As shown in Exhibit A, the existing racks were found be in varying states of disrepair. All 22 were considered dirty and had peeling or faded labels,14 had been graffitied, and 7 were empty or contained print materials that did not match the company name displayed on the rack.

The distribution of newspapers and magazines is a form of speech protected by the First Amendment; however, cities may establish reasonable time, place and manner restrictions on this form of speech. The City does not have any such restrictions in place at this time.


By ordinance, the City may regulate the location, permitting, maintenance, abandonment and number of allowed magazine racks. Within that framework, there are several options to consider:

- Vendor supplies its own rack in its own style
- Vendor supplies its own rack that meets uniform specifications established by the City
- City supplies a display "corral" within which serparate vendor racks are contained
- City supplies a consolidated rack from which all vendors must display their publications

The City may also charge fees for the right to display within the public right-of-way, provided that the fees are reasonable so as not to unreasonably infringe on the protected speech.

The most recent court challenge to a newsrack ordinance in Texas was in a suit against the City of Houston, where the Fifth Cirtcuit Court of Appeals upheld the validity of Houston's 2007 ordinance. Should the City choose to pursue reasonable time, place and manner regulation of magazine racks in the public right-of-way, staff recommends using the Houston ordinance as a starting point, while tailoring the ordinance to meet local needs and Council preferences.
