Subject: Proposed ordinance changes

Hello:

I am reaching out regarding ordinance changes we are considering in San Marcos. Like most of the State of Texas, San Marcos is growing rapidly, and we have limited water resources that must accommodate our rapidly growing population into the future. In looking for ways to stretch our water resources, it has become apparent that conservation related to landscaping and irrigation will play an important role. A large portion of our water resources are being used to irrigate turf grass in new developments. The standard for landscaping these new homes is mostly turf grass with a small bed by the front door and a few trees. Almost all of the new homes come standard with an Irrigation system. We have reviewed the Home Builders Association Sensible Landscaping guide and feel the guidance it provides makes a lot of sense, and would therefore like to implement it in our community.

The proposed ordinance changes would limit the amount of turf grass used in new development. Turf grass is defined as "a surface layer of soil bound by grass and its roots into a thick mat that requires regular maintenance, mowing and watering", which would typically require irrigation system installation and usage. Based on the HBA guide, turf grass in new homes would be limited to no more than 50% of the landscaped area. Turf grass in all other new developments would be limited to 25% of the total landscaped area. The proposed amendments would also require at least 6 inches of soil and use of drought-tolerant turf grass species, in accordance with the HBA guide.

We would love to have your input and ideas on these proposed amendments as well as your support to implement these in our community.
