

City of San Marcos Scooter Pilot Program Update

March 16, 2021

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Background

- Ordinance prohibiting "for profit" scooters May 2020
 Provided for Scooter Pilot program
- City joined University in discussion on potential Pilot with Spin
- Agreements with Spin reached August 2020
- Scooter Pilot begins September 2020



Program Monitoring

- Project team uses real time GPS software
 - Provides detailed scooter location and "dwell" time
- City staff time spent monitoring: 75 Hours (Sep. Jan.)
 - Field audits (twice weekly, random times)
- Weekly meetings
 - City / University / Spin
 - Mainstreet & Communications Dept. participation

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Performance Metrics

• Scooter Pilot Ridership Data: (Sep. 23 – Feb. 25)

Unique Riders	5,010
Trips Completed	20,207
Miles Traveled	31,163
Hours of Service	5,385

• Spin reports San Marcos is a high performer

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Public Safety & Infrastructure

- Pilot Findings Public Safety
 - Three (3) non-critical injuries reported (no hospital visits)
 - Provided socially distant form of travel during Pandemic
 - Zero (0) COVID-19 cases reported by Spin employees
- Pilot Findings Infrastructure Limitations
 - Audits suggest less than one (1) mis-parked scooter per day
 - Downtown businesses provided minimal negative feedback
 - No scooters in the river (effective "geofencing")



Community Engagement

- Spin partners with Community organizations
 - Main Street
 - Greater San Marcos Partnership
- Spin provided "Spin to Vote" free rides for Nov. 3 elections
- Spin provides "Access" discounted rides to qualified riders

Challenges

- Theft & Vandalism
 - Occurs in all scooter markets
 - Occurs to all scooter companies
 - Impacts minimized new scooter model
- <u>Travel Demand</u>
 - COVID-19
 - Downtown parking availability
 - University students remote learning



Summary

- Successful program monitoring
- Demand exists for this form of transportation
- Appears to be a safe form of transportation
- Vendor has worked closely with the community
- <u>Staff Recommendation:</u> Continue the scooter pilot program through the summer and solicit a full time provider

- City and University complete RFP solicitation
 - Both dockless bicycles & scooters required
- Council approval of selected vendor
- Full program roll-out for Fall 2021 semester
