**RE:** CRF, CDBG and other Pandemic Funds Allocated by the City

and Funding Received by Community Partners

In advance of City Council's discussion regarding the American Rescue Plan scheduled for the June 29 work session, staff has compiled a list of funding that has already been received by the City and community stakeholders. The attached tables will not be addressed in detail at the meeting; however, they help inform the amount of assistance that has been provided to the City of San Marcos and other community stakeholders.

The first table includes City programs funded by Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) approved by Council in February 2021, Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds, or money freed up in the General Fund due to CRF. The table includes a few other sources including the Federal Transit Authority, Department of Justice, and funding for animal programs.

The second table includes funding that has been received by other community partners throughout San Marcos, including Texas State University, Hays County, and other local organizations. This list is not exhaustive as there are many different sources of funds, but we attempted to capture as many as possible to show that considerable assistance has been provided in the community.
