What agencies are eligible?

- non-profit agency
- public housing authority
- City of San Marcos department
- government entity
- agencies that have CDBG or HSAB funding through the City

Organizations may propose more than one program or program in separate applications.

What programs are eligible?

- Funding must serve San Marcos residents only.
- Funding IS ALLOWED to serve people who are not United States citizens.
- Need based.
- The need served must be related to the pandemic or to the effects of the pandemic economic shutdowns.
- Public benefit (not solely for internal operations).



What expenses are eligible?

- Labor, supplies, materials, equipment
- Facility operation and maintenance
- Lease + phone, internet access

What expenses are not?

- Fundraising
- Client incentives Vehicles
- Late fees

- Furnishings



What people are eligible?

Income lower than 120% of San Marcos median household income.

SAN MARCOS MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME = \$40,370 \$48,444=(median family income*1.20)

- Applicable items listed on p. 5 Checklist
- Organization information listed on p. 12
- Standard of Conduct described on p. 14

Include a compelling description of your program or project!

- How will it be measured?
- What impact will it have, on whom?

How is it evaluated?

By members of the Human Services Advisory Board With the Scoring Criteria on p. 16
And the Risk Assessment on p. 17



1. Activity Need and Justification: Maximum of 20 Points

The activity will be evaluated on the documentation and justification of the need for the activity



2. Impact and Cost Effectiveness: Maximum of 30 Points The activity will be evaluated on:

- amount of overhead compared to program costs
- impact on the identified need
- implementation costs compared to impact
- use of available resources (financial, staff, volunteer)
- leveraged resources



3. Implementation: Maximum of 20 Points

Considerations include:

- Resources needed to manage the proposed activity are available and ready.
- Applicant has clearly defined goals focusing on results and measurable outcomes



4. Past Performance or Letters of Reference: Maximum of 20 Points

- No outstanding audit deficiencies, findings, or disallowed costs from previous projects or activities.
- Strong record in similar activities OR
- Up to three letters of recommendation.



5. Preferred Need Categories: Maximum of 10 Points

- Case Management
- Child Care
- Internet Support

- Auto Payments
- Job Training
- Homelessness Prevention



Additional Review: Risk Assessment

- Program Complexity

- Organizational Experience
- Project Experience
 Monitoring History
- Leveraged Funding
 Performance History



And then what??

- 1. City Council Funding Allocation Decisions July 6
- 2. Contract with the City similar to Human Services Advisory Board (HSAB) as soon as possible after July 6
- 3. Quarterly reports beneficiaries and impact
- 4. Payments and funding up front, quarterly; may be customized to the program as needed
- 5. Timeline set by contract



Reports and Payment What do you think of the following?

Reports similar to CDBG + HSAB (examples)

- 1. Beneficiaries and Impact
- 2. Balance Sheet and Income Statement

Payments up front each quarter, even amounts
