Overall Requirements

- Agency must have a track record of producing results OR up to three letters of recommendation
- Difficulty must be related to the pandemic
- San Marcos resident, including non-citizens
- Additional points for case management, child care, internet support, car payments, job training, homelessness prevention

Application Evaluation Criteria

- 1. Activity Need and Justification: 20 Points
- 2. Impact and Cost Effectiveness: 30 Points overhead, leveraging other resources
- 3. Implementation: 20 Points focus on measurable outcomes
- 4. Past Performance or Letters of Reference: 20 Points
- 5. Preferred Need Categories: 10 Points
